2	(WHEREUPON, the public hearing began					
3	at 6:00 p.m.)					
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: We're here for a					
5	public hearing regarding a review of the					
6	Commission's rules. This is going to be an					
7	informal process. We'll call people up to the					
8	podium to make any statement they'd like to make,					
9	if anyone wants to make a statement. And this is					
10	also being web cast, so there might be people out					
11	in the wider world watching.					
12	My name is Morris Woodruff. I'm the					
13	chief judge and secretary of the Commission. And					
14	with me on the podium here is Chairman Daniel Hall					
15	and Commissioner Maida Coleman.					
16	Before we take comments from the					
17	public, I'll ask Jamie Myers to come up and explain					
18	what the process is all about.					
19	MS. MYERS: Thank you, Judge. As you					
20	mentioned, I'm Jamie Myers. I'm here on behalf of					
21	the Staff of the Missouri Public Service					
22	Commission.					
23	And this hearing is part of our					
24	general rule review that we're undergoing. It's					
25	part of Executive Order 17-03 that Governor Eric					

Greitens signed earlier this year. It entails that

- 2. every state agency review its rules and regulations 3 and look to see where it can make its rules more 4 effective, streamline them, and make them more 5 efficient. So that's what we're doing here. 6 7 We're here to gather comments on how we can do 8 that. So as part of our process here at the Commission, we are reviewing all of our rules. are creating a cost/benefit analysis worksheet for 10 each rule to kind of gather what are the costs of 11 12 this rule, what are the benefits, how can we make them better. 13
- Some early thoughts we've had on reviewing our rules is we're looking at Chapter 3
- 16 in particular. Right now it has a lot of the
- 17 filing requirements. One thought was, is it
- 18 necessary to have its own standalone chapter?
- 19 Should we maybe separate them out and put them in
- 20 their chapter-specific areas? For instance, would
- 21 electric filing requirements be better fit in
- 22 Chapter 20, which is the electric rules? Would
- 23 natural gas rules filing requirements be better fit
- 24 in Chapter 40, which is natural gas?
- 25 Some other areas we're looking at is

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- 1 we're looking at reviewing for usefulness, areas
- 2 such as Chapter 13, which is service and billing
- 3 practices, as well as all of our teleco rules which
- 4 can be found in Chapter 29, 31, 34, 36 and 37.
- 5 We're also updating language where there's outdated
- 6 language and eliminating any unnecessary language
- 7 that we're finding.
- 8 With that in mind, this process goes
- 9 on. We're under a time line of December 31st
- 10 having our internal review finished and those
- 11 results sent to the Governor's Office.
- 12 And at this time I would welcome
- 13 anyone to make comments should they have them.
- 14 We're here to answer any questions that you may
- 15 have as well.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
- 17 CHAIRMAN HALL: I have a couple
- 18 comments. How many public comments have we
- 19 received thus far?
- 20 MS. MYERS: We have received a total
- 21 of 36 thus far.
- 22 CHAIRMAN HALL: And that comment
- 23 period will remain open until when?
- MS. MYERS: We are planning to leave
- ours open until December, until we've completed our

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internal review. The Governor's executive order I 1 believe required a minimum of 30 days or 60 days. 2. 3 There was a minimum, but that's not a maximum. we were given the guidance that we're welcome to 4 5 keep our comment period open as long as we would like, so we thought we might as well keep it open 6 7 the entire process. So as we're going, we're continuing to receive comments. 8 9 CHAIRMAN HALL: Thank you. 10 JUDGE WOODRUFF: We have a few people 11 in the audience. Does anyone wish to come forward 12 and make a statement? I don't see anyone stepping 13 forward. Mr. Williams, you look like you're... MR. WILLIAMS: Judge, I was actually 14 15 going to ask a question of Ms. Myers. With respect 16 to the comment period, has that been part of public 17 notice as far as how long we're holding the comment period open? 18 19 MS. MYERS: You know, we haven't made

a public notice. One thing we could do is file

some sort of notice in the AW docket just to make

that clear. It's been left up to every agency to

decide. As long as you meet the minimum, there's

no reason that you have to cut it off. But we've

also made several press release announcements that

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1	talk about the comment period.				
2	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Ms. Myers				
3	referenced the case that is open on this matter.				
4	It is AW-2017-0336. So that is available on EFIS				
5	if anyone wants to take a look at that.				
6	MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you very much.				
7	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Anyone				
8	in the audience wishing to come forward and make a				
9	statement?				
10	All right. I don't see anyone coming				
11	forward. So thank you all for coming, and we are				
12	adjourned.
