ORDER OF PARTIAL IMPLEMENTATION

On December 29, 1989, the Commission issued a Report and Order, in Case No. TO-87-131 directing the local exchange companies (LECs) in the State of Missouri to offer an extra-exchange calling program at less than toll rates in exchanges demonstrating a community of interest. This program of extra-exchange calling is called community optional service (COS). In its Report and Order of December 29, 1989, the Commission established that a community of interest is demonstrated when an average of six calls per access line per month are made from the petitioning exchange to the requested exchange and two-thirds of the customers in the petitioning exchange make two or more calls to the requested exchange per month.

Of the two routes studied in this case the Holt/Kansas City Metropolitan area route has met these criteria thereby demonstrating a community of interest. Therefore, the Commission will direct the LECs providing service to these exchanges to offer COS on this route as set forth below. The Holt/Kearney route has not quite met the criteria demonstrating a community of interest. This route came within .8% of meeting these criteria. The Commission will address the disposition of this route by subsequent order.

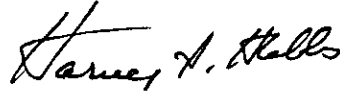
It is therefore ordered:

1. That the local exchange companies providing service to the exchange of Holt and the Kansas City Metropolitan area be directed hereby to provide community optional service (COS) on this route within 120 days from the date that the results of the calling study were filed with this Commission.

2. That the local exchange companies responsible for providing community optional service (COS) on the Holt/Kansas City Metropolitan area route be directed hereby to inform the Commission when COS is implemented.

3. That this order shall become effective on the 22nd day of June, 1990.
