ORDER TO FILE TARIFFS

On June 3, 1994, the Commission issued a notice advising interested persons that Pennsylvania Alternative Communications, d/b/a Pace Long Distance Service (Applicant) had applied to the Commission for certification as a competitive interexchange telecommunications company. Interested persons were advised to file motions to intervene by June 20, 1994. No motions to intervene have been received. The requirements of due process are satisfied when interested persons have been given notice and an opportunity to be heard. Since no proper party has filed an application to intervene, and there have been no requests for hearing, the Commission determines that a hearing is not necessary and that the Applicant may submit evidence in support of its application by verified statement. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989).

The Commission also determines that Applicant should file its proposed tariff, carrying a thirty-day effective date, indicating the rates and regulations under which it proposes to offer services. The proposed tariff should also reflect the company's competitive status and indicate the statutory and regulatory requirements expected to be waived by the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Pennsylvania Alternative Communications, d/b/a Pace Long Distance Service, file with the Commission its proposed tariff, on or before 3:00 p.m. on July 6, 1994. The proposed tariff shall indicate the rates and regulations under which Applicant proposes to offer services, reflect the Applicant's competitive status, and indicate the statutory and regulatory requirements expected to be waived by the Commission.
 - 2. That this order shall be effective on the date hereof.
