## SECOND MOTION TO SUSPEND FILING OF THE PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) and for this Second Motion to Suspend states as follows:

1. Southwestern Bell Communications, Inc. d/b/a Southwestern Bell Long Distance filed an application on August 4, 1998, for a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange telecommunications service in the State of Missouri.

2. The Commission issued an order on September 9, 1998, granting intervention to Mid-Missouri Group, Sprint Communications Company L.P., MCI Telecommunications Corporation, McLeodUSA Telecommunications Services, Inc., AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc., CompTel-Mo, and Digital Teleport, Inc. Participation without intervention was granted to Fidelity Telephone Company and Small Telephone Company Group. The Commission ordered the parties to submit a proposed procedural schedule no later than October 9, 1998.

3. The parties met in a pre-hearing conference on October 6, 1998, and agreed that the date for submitting the proposed procedural schedule should be suspended while the parties negotiated a stipulation. The parties were granted an extension until November 6, 1998. 4. The parties are still in the process of negotiating a stipulation. The Staff requests that the Commission further suspend the filing of a proposed procedural schedule or in the alternative, a stipulation, no later than November 30, 1998. All parties agree to suspend the proposed procedural schedule filing.

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WHEREFORE, the Staff respectfully requests that the Commission suspend the filing of a proposed procedural schedule until November 30, 1998.
