I responded to his email explaining that Aqua Missouri operates over 50 treatment facilities in the Cole and Callaway County service area, which range from anaerobic lagoons to extended air treatment facilities and which serve as few as a single multi-family dwelling to over 100 connections, thus necessitating a uniform rate for the service area.
