## STATEMENT OF ISSUES

- 1. DID THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION ABUSE ITS DISCRETION IN DENYING APPELLANT INTEVENTION.
- 2. DOES DUE PROCESS REQUIRE INTERVENTION AFTER A FINDING APPELLANT'S INTERSTS ARE DIFFERENT THAN THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
- 3. WAS APPELLANT DENIED DUE PROCESS FOR FAILURE OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO MAKE A DETERMINATION AND DEFINE "GENERAL PUBLIC INTEREST".
- 4. DID THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION ABUSE ITS DISCRETION FOR FAILING TO CONSIDER THE TERMS OF THE ASSET PURCHASE AGREEMENT IN THE INSTANT CASE.
- 5. DID ALLOWING APPELLANT TO FILE AN AMICIS CURIAE BRIEF AFFORD DUE PROCESS AND EQUAL PROTECTION OF APPELLANT'S INTERESTS WHICH WERE DETERMINED TO BE DIFFERENT THAN THOSE OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
