**RESPONSE TO ORDER DIRECTING FILING**

**COME NOW** Kansas City Power & Light Company (“KCP&L”) and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (“GMO”) and file this Response to the Order Directing Filing, issued on April 12, 2013 (“Order Directing Filing”) in File No. EA-2013-0098.

1. In its Order Directing Filing, the Commission ordered KCP&L and GMO, the applicants in File No. EA-2012-0367 (“Transfer Application”), to supplement the Transfer Application by listing each county in which any part of any affected political subdivision is located. See Order Directing Filing at 2. The Commission cited the Section 393.190.1<sup>1</sup> requirement that KCP&L and GMO state in their Transfer Application any impact the transfer will have on the tax revenues of the political subdivisions in which any assets to be transferred are located, and that the Commission send a copy of the tax revenue impact information obtained by it to the county clerk of each county in which a portion of the affected political subdivision is located.

2. KCP&L and GMO stated in paragraph 43 of the Transfer Application, pursuant to the Section 393.190.1 requirement that the Commission cites, that “the proposed transfer of the transmission property related to the Projects will have no impact upon the tax revenues of the political subdivisions in which the new transmission facilities or equipment are located because the transfers will occur at cost.”

3. As KCP&L and GMO noted in Section IV “Property Subject to Transfer Authority,” and specifically in paragraph 41, of the Transfer Application, no assets associated with the Sibley-Nebraska City Project will be transferred, as there is no existing real property associated with that project at this time. Thus, the Transfer Application requests the Commission’s Section 393.190.1 authority to transfer assets associated only with the Iatan-Nashua Project.

4. A map of the Iatan-Nashua Project is attached to the Transfer Application as Exhibit 7, as noted in paragraph 40 of that application. This map shows that the Iatan-Nashua Project is located entirely within Platte and Clay counties, which KCP&L and GMO also indicated in paragraph 27 of the Transfer Application. However, the Nashua substation and a very small portion of the transmission line are located in Kansas City, Missouri, which spans four counties: Platte, Clay, Jackson, and Cass.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to the Order Directing Filing, KCP&L and GMO respectfully request that the Commission supplement the Transfer Application, No. EA-2012-0367, with the county information contained in paragraph 4 herein.
