ORDER DIRECTING PARTIES TO FILE PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE


On December 15, 1999, AquaSource Development Company (AquaSource) filed a Motion to Suspend Procedural Schedule. That Motion indicated that all of the parties, AquaSource, the Staff of the Commission, and the Office of the Public Counsel, had reached an agreement in principle regarding a settlement that would resolve the entire case. The motion indicated that for several reasons, the parties had been unable to finalize the exact wording of a stipulation and agreement. As a result, AquaSource requested that the procedural schedule be suspended so that it would not be required to file testimony that would otherwise be due. The motion indicated that if the parties were not able to reach an agreement, they would propose a new procedural schedule. On December 16, in response to AquaSource's motion, the Commission issued an Order Canceling Procedural Schedule.

The parties have not yet filed the anticipated stipulation and agreement. The Commission wishes to move this case forward. Therefore, the parties will be directed to file a new proposed procedural schedule. The parties need not file a new proposed procedural schedule if they instead file a stipulation and agreement that will resolve all the issues in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the parties shall file a proposed procedural schedule no later than February 8, 2000.
2. That this order shall become effective on January 31, 2000.
