ORDER APPROVING TARIFFS

By order of September 3, 1998, the Commission approved the applications filed by Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE (AmerenUE) and Farmers' Electric Cooperative.

On May 24, 1999, AmerenUE filed tariffs intended to reflect the acquisition. Those tariffs were assigned Tariff File No. 199900902 and bore an effective date of June 23. On June 2, 1999, AmerenUE filed a substitute sheet. On June 7, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a memorandum in which it states that it has reviewed the tariffs, finds

that they are correct and comply with the Commission's order, and recommends approval. Staff also states that the change of supplier has now been accomplished for all affected customers and the associated assets have been sold, transferred or assigned.

The Commission has reviewed the tariff filing and the Staff memorandum and has determined the filing to be in compliance with the Commission's order, and that all transactions approved have been completed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Tariff No. 199900902, filed May 24, 1999, by Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE is hereby approved as substituted for service on or after June 23, 1999.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on June 23, 1999.
 - 3. That this case may be closed on June 24, 1999.
