ORDER ESTABLISHING DOCKET

On August 18, 1997, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a motion to establish a docket. Staff states that Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company (MGE), is a gas corporation subject to Commission jurisdiction under Sections 386.020(18) and 386.020(42), RSMo Supp. 1996. Staff states that on July 25, 1997, at approximately 11:50 a.m., the ignition of natural gas apparently caused a flash fire on the west side of Lee's Summit Road, south of Interstate 70, in Independence, Missouri. Staff states that the fire started at a Southwestern Bell manhole site and that MGE provides natural gas service in Independence.

Staff states that two persons performing contract work for Southwestern Bell were injured as a result of the fire and that Staff has initiated a formal investigation into the incident.

Staff requests that the Commission establish a docket for the purpose of receiving information, including a gas incident report relating to the incident.

The Commission finds that a docket should be established to receive information relevant to the above-described incident and to determine what, if any, action by the Commission is warranted. Thus, the Commission will establish docket GS-98-72.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Case No. GS-98-72 is hereby established for the purpose of receiving the Staff incident report and the response of Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company, thereto pertaining to the incident which occurred on July 25, 1997.
- 2. That the Commission's Energy Department shall file, through the General Counsel's office, its accident report within one hundred twenty (120) days of the effective date of this order.
 - 3. That this order shall become effective on August 25, 1997.
