ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Secured Technologies, L.C. (ST) applied to the Missouri Public Service Commission on December 4, 1998, for a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.440, RSMo 1994¹. ST asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. ST is a Texas limited liability company with its principal office located at 1418 Bitters Road, Suite 2, San Antonio, Texas 78216.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications and Opportunity to Intervene on December 8, 1998 directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by December 23, 1998. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. <u>State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises Incorporated v. Public</u> <u>Service Commission</u>, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the BR

Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application.

ST filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on January 4, 1999 and on January 5, 1999. The tariff's effective date was January 18, 1999. ST's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies ST as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. ST intends to provide interexchange telecommunications services including 1+ direct dial, 800/888/877 Services, Operator Services, and Debit Card Services.

In its Memorandum filed on January 7, 1999, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) recommended that the Commission grant ST a certificate of service authority, competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff as amended to become effective on January 18, 1999.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange telecommunications market is in the public interest and ST should be granted a certificate of service authority. The Commission finds that the services ST proposes to offer are competitive and ST should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that ST's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and is similar

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to tariffs approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange carriers. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on December 4, 1998 shall be approved as amended to become effective on January 18, 1999.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Secured Technologies, L.C. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.

2. That Secured Technologies, L.C. is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
