ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME TO COMPLETE SURVEY

The Commission issued its Report and Order in this case on November 26, 1997, in which, inter alia, it ordered Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC) to complete a survey of its service territory. On April 9, 1998, MAWC filed a request for an extension of time from April 11 to July 10 to file the results of this survey. On June 29, the Commission granted this extension.

In its July 10 filing, MAWC provided much of the information required by the Commission's November 26, 1997 Report and Order, but stated that it needs additional time to complete the on-the-ground portion of the survey of its service territories, and requested an

B RPA 170 530 extension until July 1, 1999 to complete that portion. MAWC states that it contacted the Staff and the Office of the Public Counsel, and neither has any objection to this extension.

Since the on-the-ground portion of the survey will take a considerable amount of time to complete, and since neither the Staff nor the Office of the Public Counsel has any objection to this extension, the Commission will grant it.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Missouri-American Water Company shall have until July 1, 1999 to file the results of the on-the-ground portion of the survey of its service territory.
- 2. That this order shall become effective on August 28, 1998.
