## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) by and through one of its attorneys, and for its Recommendation states as follows:

- 1. On February 25, 2000, Innovative Telecom Corp. (ITC), a competitive interexchange telecommunications carrier, filed an Application for Commission approval to transfer its assets to Enhanced Global Convergence Services, Inc. (EGCS) on a prospective basis. EGCS is also a competitive interexchange telecommunications carrier.
- ITC was certificated in Missouri to provide intrastate interexchange services in Case No. TA-96-388. EGCS has been granted a certificate of service authority in Case No. TA-2000-530.
- 3. The sale of assets is governed by §392.300 RSMo 1994 and 4 CSR 240-060(7). Applicable case law provides that the Commission may approve an asset transfer if it is "not detrimental to the public interest". See <u>State ex. rel Fee Fee Trunk Sewer, Inc. v. Litz</u>, 596 S.W. 2d 466, 468 (Mo. App. E.D. 1980).



- 4. Staff has reviewed the application for asset transfer approval and has concluded that the transaction will not be detrimental to the public interest.
- 5. In the attached Memorandum, which is labeled Appendix A, the Staff summarizes its review of the application and recommends that the Commission enter an Order which:
- A. Approves the application to transfer the assets of ITC to EGCS on a prospective basis.

Recommendation to Approve the Transfer of Assets from Innovative Telecom

Corp. to Enhanced Global Convergence Services, Inc.

On February 25, 2000, Innovative Telecom Corp. (ITC), a competitive interexchange telecommunications carrier, filed an Application for Order Approving Transfer of Assets (Application) seeking to transfer its assets to Enhanced Global Convergence Services, Inc. (EGCS), also a competitive interexchange telecommunications carrier.

ITC was certificated to provide intrastate interexchange services in Missouri on June 12, 1996 (Case No. TA-96-388) as a provider of prepaid calling cards. ITC and EGCS consummated a transfer of assets in August of 1999 intending at that time to focus on transaction processing on behalf of other carriers rather than providing common carrier service in Missouri. Since the transfer of assets was made, ITC and EGCS have cooperated in the provision of intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri under the existing ITC certificate.

After the consummation of the asset transfer, the companies decided to focus on providing toll services by resale in Missouri, but EGCS had not yet been certificated in Missouri. On June 2, 2000, the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) granted EGCS a certificate of service authority effective June 7, 2000 (Case No. TA-2000-530, Tariff File No. 200000766). EGCS intends to provide interexchange telecommunications services including directory assistance and debit card services.

ITC acknowledges in the Application that "... it is now impossible to seek approval of the Missouri Commission of the transaction *in advance* of consummation ..., [therefore] ITC is making this filing seeking approval on a *prospective* basis." (emphasis added)

Pursuant to 4 CSR 240.2 (F) – (H), the Application further states that

- (1) EGCS will provide service under the EGCS certificate.
- (2) EGCS will provide service under the EGCS tariff, and all prepaid calling cards issued by ITC will continue to be honored.
- (3) The proposed transfer of assets will not have any impact on the tax revenues of the political subdivisions in which any structures, facilities, or equipment of the companies involved in the transaction are located.
- (4) There are no pending or final judgments of any federal or state agency involving customer services or rates against the asset purchaser, EGCS.

Counsel for ITC states that ITC will defer a decision on canceling its current certificate until the MoPSC issues its order regarding this Application. Staff recognizes that the transfer of assets between ITC and EGCS has already been completed, but Staff does not feel that penalties should be assessed given that ITC is seeking approval on a prospective basis.

According to 4 CSR 240-2.060 (3), competitively classified companies are exempt from providing certain information such as public interest information in applications to merge, consolidate, or sell/transfer assets. Based on the limited information provided to the Telecommunications Department Staff (Staff), the Staff does not believe the transaction will be detrimental to the public interest since a customer can freely switch to another provider.

The purchaser, EGCS, has been granted a Certificate of Service Authority as a competitive interexchange telecommunications carrier in Missouri, therefore, Staff recommends that the Commission approve the Application to transfer the assets of ITC to EGCS, on a *prospective* basis. Staff is unaware of any other filing that may affect, or be affected by, this filing.
