The purpose of this filing is to change language in the applicability clause of Schedule GA. Schedule GA is a general service all electric tariff that is designed for service through one meter at one point of delivery for all electrical needs. The current tariff is also applicable to a multiple-occupancy building only when the occupants of the building are furnished with electric service on a rent inclusion basis and service to such building was supplied continuously under this schedule from a data prior to May 6, 1978. It is Kansas City Power & Light Co.'s (KCPL) current policy and interpretation that the above "service to such multiple-occupancy building was supplied continuously under this schedule from a date prior to May 6, 1978" refers only to residential multiple-occupancy buildings.

This filing changes the language in the applicability clause of Schedule GA to clarify the Company's interpretation that only residential master-metered multiple-occupancy buildings are limited to those supplied continuously under this schedule from a date prior to May 6, 1978.

I objected to the proposed change because residential mastered metered multiple-occupancy buildings should have been placed on the residential schedules in the rate design case. KCPL did an analyses to determine if there were any such customers still on schedule GA. As it turned out, there are no residential customers and KCPL agreed to remove the language from the proposed tariff. On February 2, 1989 Kansas City Power and Light filed a substitute tariff to remove the reference to residential buildings.

I have reviewed the substituted tariff and have no objections to allowing commercial and industrial master metered multiple-occupancy buildings on this schedule. Therefore, I have no objection to allowing the proposed tariff to go into effect on the proposed effective date of February 13, 1989.
