
ORDER DIRECTING STATUS FILING

The Commission issued its Order Approving Application to Reorganize Corporate Structure on September 30, 1997. Pursuant to ordered paragraph 8 of that order, WorldCom, Inc., MFS Intelenet of Missouri, Inc., MFS Communications Company, Inc., MFS Network Technologies, Inc., and WorldCom Technologies, Inc. were directed to file a pleading notifying the Commission of the completion of all of the transactions proposed in the joint application, along with the date of completion, within 10 days after the completion of the transactions.

Counsel for the companies filed a letter on November 3, indicating that the corporate reorganization had been completed with the exception of two components: (1) MFS Intelenet of Missouri, Inc. has not merged into WorldCom Technologies, Inc., and continues to operate in Missouri pending the issuance of a certificate of service authority to provide basic local and local exchange telecommunications to WorldCom Technologies; and (2) MFS Network Technologies, Inc. has not been removed from the chain of corporate ownership of WorldCom Technologies, Inc., since the WorldCom companies are still awaiting a private letter ruling from the Internal Revenue Service.

The company is directed to notify the Commission of the status of the transactions and to make any appropriate compliance filings no later than February 16, 1998.
