ORDER SETTING DATE FOR FILING RESPONSES

Issue Date: March 8, 2018

Effective Date: March 8, 2018

Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri (“Ameren Missouri”) filed an application¹ for a certificate of convenience and necessity (“CCN”) and an accompanying tariff.² Both filings address a pilot solar program, by which Ameren Missouri customers may underwrite a solar facility and receive electricity at a solar rate. Ameren Missouri made those filings pursuant to the Commission’s order³ directing the parties to carry out an agreement made earlier in this action.⁴

Ameren Missouri seeks expedited treatment for the application and tariff as set forth in the agreement. As to the application, the agreement provides:

. . . Staff (and **any** other **Signatory** desiring to conduct a review) shall make its best efforts to complete its **review** within **45 days** after filing the CCN application, and the Signatories will make their best efforts in good faith to support any necessary procedural schedule or other process at the Commission that would allow the **Commission** to **decide** the CCN application within **90 days** of its filing.⁵

As to the tariff, the agreement provides:

The Signatories agree that they will not oppose said tariff becoming effective **30 days** after its filing or otherwise seek suspension or rejection of the tariff **except** on the grounds that the rate reflected in the tariff was **improperly calculated**.⁶

Those provisions set limits on the parties' input.

Therefore, the Commission will set expedited dates for responses to the application and tariff.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Commission's staff shall file a recommendation on, and any other party may, file a response to:

- a. The tariff no later than March 23, 2018.
- b. The application no later than April 23, 2018.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
