ORDER APPROVING TARIFF SHEETS

On May 2, 1995, Sprint Communications Company L.P. (Sprint) submitted proposed tariff sheets designed to extend the Sprint SenseSM Charter Promotion and to introduce the Sprint Clarity® Basic Promotion. Sprint requested expedited approval of these tariff sheets so that Missouri customers can benefit from the promotions. This docket was created to consider the request for expedited treatment.

On May 16, 1995, Commission Staff filed a memorandum recommending approval of the tariff sheets. Staff indicates that the promotions offer a waiver of the monthly recurring charge for Sprint Sense Charter and a per-minute discount in rates and a waiver of surcharges for Sprint Clarity Basic.

The Commission has reviewed the proposed tariff sheets and Staff recommendation and finds the tariff sheets are reasonable and should be approved. The promotions will allow Sprint to waive or reduce rates for the two services to Missouri customers. The Commission also finds there is good cause to approve the tariff sheets on less than thirty days notice.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the revised tariff sheets filed by Sprint Communications Company L.P. regarding Sprint SenseSM Charter and Sprint Clarity[®] Basic are hereby approved for service on and after May 18, 1995. The tariff sheets approved are:
