RESPONSE TO REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL TIME TO FILE RESPONSE

COMES NOW the Office of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel) and for its Response to Request for Additional Time to File Response states as follows:

- 1. On May 16, 2002 Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE requested that the Public Service Commission (Commission) extend the deadline for responding to the procedural schedule proposed by Staff on May 6, 2002. This procedural schedule is supported by Public Counsel.
- 2. Company contacted Public Counsel to discuss settlement of this case for the first time today, May 17, 2002. Settlement discussions may continue in the future; however, extending procedural deadlines in this case will not necessarily hasten any settlement. In fact, approving the procedural schedule favored by Staff and Public Counsel would tend to focus the parties on the important issues in this case.

3. Over \$9 million in undisputed sharing credits are now due to ratepayers. According to Ameren Corporation's Quarterly Report (SEC Form 10-Q) filed on May 15, 2002, an estimate of the total value of Commission Staff and Public Counsel issues in this case could result in an approximately \$80 million of sharing credits.

Complicating the resolution in this case of sharing credits for the last year of the Experimental Alternative Regulation Plan II is the relevance of this issue to the proposal by Company to have the Commission adopt a brand new alternative regulation plan in Case No. EC-2002-1, which is scheduled for hearings during the month of July 2002.

WHEREFORE, Public Counsel respectfully requests that the Commission adopt the procedural schedule proposed by the Staff on May 6, 2002.
