SR-2013-0321 and WR-2013-0322, Lincoln County Sewer and 4 5 Water, LLC's Request For Increases In Their Sewer And Water Rates. 6 7 At this time -- or I should say my name is Kennard 8 Jones. I am the Judge assigned to this matter. Let's 9 take entries of appearances, beginning with Lincoln 10 County. 11 MR. COOPER: Thank you, your Honor. Dean Cooper 12 with the law firm of Brydon, Swearengen & England, P.C., 13 appearing on behalf of Lincoln County Sewer and Water, LLC. The Court Reporter has the address. 14 JUDGE JONES: And the Office of Public Counsel. 15 MS. BAKER: Thank you. Christina Baker, P.O. Box 16 17 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102, appearing on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel and the customers. 18 19 JUDGE JONES: And from the Staff of the Commission. 20 21 MS. MOORE: Thank you. For the Missouri Public Service Commission, Amy Moore and Kevin Thompson, P.O. Box 22 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102. 23 JUDGE JONES: Okay. So, Staff and Company want to 24 25 come to an agreement?

1	MS. BAKER: Correct.
2	MS. MOORE: Correct.
3	JUDGE KENNARD: And, OPC, you're requesting a
4	local public hearing?
5	MS. BAKER: Yes.
6	JUDGE KENNARD: So, we have to, I guess,
7	presumably, complete a local public hearing and an
8	evidentiary hearing in two months, and get an order issued
9	within two months. I don't know how feasible that is.
10	So, I believe in Chapter 3, Commission has some power to
11	waive the rules of the chapter. That may be considered,
12	because the Company filed just got their rates approved
13	last July when they were granted the CCN, and little time
14	has passed.
15	So, somebody thinks that that was wrong. So,
16	maybe we can get it right this time.
17	MR. COOPER: Well, there's been some additional
18	investment. From the Company's perspective, there's been
19	some additional investment.
20	JUDGE KENNARD: That's the since July, the
21	Company's have invested. I mean, this is a fact, right?
22	MR. COOPER: Yes.
23	MS. BAKER: Yes.
24	JUDGE KENNARD: So, the impact or mode of the
25	investment is in dispute. What exactly are you guys

arguing about? 1 2 MR. COOPER: There's a variety of things, your 3 Honor. JUDGE KENNARD: Let's start here. What do you 4 5 agree on? 6 MS. BAKER: We did attempt to come to, at least, a 7 partial settlement, and we weren't able, at least by that deadline. We're still -- I think all of us are open to 8 9 discussing as we proceed; but, until this point, we don't even have a partial agreement. 10 JUDGE KENNARD: You don't have -- so, you don't 11 12 agree -- you haven't come to an agreement on anything in 13 particular? 14 MR. COOPER: No. I guess I would think that there would be the possibility of at least a partial agreement 15 on some things. You know, how many, it remains to be 16 17 seen. JUDGE KENNARD: Okay. Well, do you all agree that 18 there should be a rate increase? 19 MR. COOPER: No. There's a difference of opinion 20 21 on that. JUDGE KENNARD: Oh, wow. Check that out. All 22 right. Let's see if there's anything else. Would you all 23 consider arbitration? That's provided for in the rules? 24 You haven't thought about it? 25

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1	MR. COOPER: I haven't given it any significant	
2	thought.	
3	JUDGE KENNARD: Okay. All right. Well, maybe you	
4	ought to talk about that. Let's see. Well, I guess the	
5	only thing I would add is I looked through some of the	
6	customer comments from the rate case, and I don't know if	
7	I should ask this question, but I will anyway.	
8	Have have the company in your opinion, Mr.	
9	Cooper, do the Company's investments address some of those	
10	concerns in the public conference?	
11	MR. COOPER: I have not gotten into those to take	
12	a look at them, so I can't even reply now.	
13	JUDGE KENNARD: Okay. Do you know, Ms. Moore, if	
14	that is the case?	
15	MS. MOORE: Just	
16	JUDGE KENNARD: Are you aware that they've	
17	invested?	
18	MS. MOORE: Yes. From memory, I would say that	
19	the investments the Company made to address some of the	
20	concerns of the customers.	
21	JUDGE KENNARD: And, Ms. Baker, do you agree with	
22	that?	
23	MS. BAKER: I would say some, but not all,	
24	certainly.	
25	JUDGE KENNARD: Okay. Well, we can try to do it	

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1	by September. I really don't know how feasible that is	
2	and, like I said in the beginning, I will look for ways to	
3	increase the time line because I'd rather get it right	
4	than hurry up and get it wrong. So, you all might talk	
5	about that, also.	
6	The whole public hearing, we will take care of on	
7	our end. And scheduling, does it matter? I guess you	
8	want the local public hearing prior to the evidentiary	
9	hearing, certainly, right?	
10	MS. BAKER: Yes.	
11	JUDGE KENNARD: All right. Well, we'll try to get	
12	that scheduled within the notice requirements of the	
13	rules. Is there anything you all want to discuss on the	
14	record that I haven't brought up?	
15	MR. COOPER: I don't think so.	
16	JUDGE KENNARD: With that, we will go off the	
17	record, and maybe you guys can come to an agreement. If	
18	not, we'll reach a conclusion some other way. All right.	
19	MS. MOORE: Thank you.	
20	(Adjournment.)
