ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE AND TARIFFS

This order cancels the certificate of service authority and tariffs of Total Communication Services, Inc.

On March 22, 2005, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission moved to cancel the certificate of service authority and accompanying tariffs of Total Communication Services, Inc. In support thereof, Staff stated that Total had requested, by letter, that its certificate of service authority and tariffs be cancelled. Staff stated further that this Commission granted Total an IXC certificate and approved its tariffs on January 31, 1995, in Case No. TA-95-182. On April 19, 2004, the Missouri Secretary of State issued a Certificate of Withdrawal to Total. Total has no Missouri customers. Staff stated that Total has not yet filed its Annual Report for 2003, but does not owe any assessments. Staff urges the Commission to cancel Total's certificate and tariff.

The Commission will grant the requested relief and cancel Total's certificate and tariff.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- That the Motion to Open Case and Cancel Certificate of Service Authority and Accompanying Tariff of Total Communication Services, Inc., filed on March 22, 2005, by the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, is granted.
- 2. That the certificate of service authority granted to Total Communication Services, Inc., in Case No. TA-95-182, is canceled.
- 3. That the tariff of Total Communication Services, Inc., P.S.C. MO No. 1, approved in Case No. TA-95-182, is canceled.
 - 4. That this order shall become effective on May 2, 2005.
 - 5. That this case may be closed on May 3, 2005.
