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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Good afternoon, everyone. We're here today for a prehearing conference in Case 3 No. SR-2004-0532, which concerns Timber Creek Sewer 4 Company's request for a small company rate increase. And 5 6 we'll begin today by taking entries of appearance, beginning with Staff. 7 8 MR. SNODGRASS: Yes. Good afternoon, 9 Judge. My name is Cliff Snodgrass. I represent the Staff 10 of the Missouri Public Service Commission. My business 11 address is Governor's Office Building, Suite 800, 200 Madison Street, P.O. Box 360, here in the big city of 12 Jefferson City, Missouri. 13 14 JUDGE WOODRUFF: For Public Counsel? MS. O'NEILL: Good afternoon. Ruth O'Neill 15 for the Office of the Public Counsel. Our mailing address 16 is P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. 17 18 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for the company? 19 MR. FINNEGAN: Jeremiah Finnegan, Finnegan, Conrad & Peterson, L.C., 3100 Broadway, Suite 1209, 20 Kansas City, Missouri 64111. 21 22 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, thank 23 you all for being here today. I called this conference 24 simply because I wanted to get some idea of where we go 25 from here. As you know, there's been an agreement between

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1 the company and Staff, and Public Counsel's proposed an 2 additional condition that's not acceptable to the Staff or the company. So we need to make some sort of 3 determination on how to resolve this and whether or not we 4 need to have a hearing. 5 6 Let me begin with you, Ms. O'Neill. Do you 7 believe we need a hearing? 8 MS. O'NEILL: Your Honor, I think that if 9 we -- if the parties can have some discussions today, 10 there's a good chance we can resolve these issues and be 11 able to come up with an agreement that's acceptable to all the parties. I've had some discussions with Staff, I've 12 had some discussions with Mr. Finnegan, and I think that 13 we're on our way to working this out. 14 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Very good. Anything you 15 16 want to say, Mr. Snodgrass? 17 MR. SNODGRASS: Well, Judge, I think that that -- I appreciate that sentiment, and we're certainly 18 19 willing to listen and talk here with all the parties 20 today, and hopefully we can resolve something. 21 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Very good. Mr. Finnegan? 22 MR. FINNEGAN: I'm hoping we can resolve 23 something as well. 24 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Sounds like we're on a 25 good track here, then. Well, I'm going to go ahead and

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1 leave you to your discussions, then. I will ask that you 2 give me a report as to what happens. 3 MR. SNODGRASS: Certainly. MS. O'NEILL: Certainly. 4 JUDGE WOODRUFF: In fact, I'll go ahead and 5 6 make the order that either give me an agreement or a proposed procedural schedule by Friday of this week. I 7 believe that would be the 11th. 8 9 MR. SNODGRASS: Would that be a joint or 10 singular pleading for each party? JUDGE WOODRUFF: Should be joint either 11 way, assuming you can agree upon a procedural schedule 12 that you reach. Doesn't have to be anything elaborate. 13 14 MR. SNODGRASS: Okay. Thank you, Judge. 15 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Some indication of when you expect that you'll be able to file a Stipulation & 16 Agreement if that's needed or whatever needs to be done. 17 18 Anything else while we're on the record, 19 then? 20 MS. O'NEILL: I don't think so. Friday is 21 the 11th, yes. 22 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, thank 23 you all very much, then. We're off the record. 24 WHEREUPON, the prehearing conference was 25 concluded.

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
