STAFF RESPONSE TO COMMISSION QUESTIONS

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff), by and through counsel, and submits its <u>Staff Response to Commission Questions</u> as follows:

1. On August 14, 2009, the Missouri Public Service Commission issued an <u>Order Directing Filing</u>, ordering the parties to Commission Case No. TA-2009-0327 to file a pleading answering four questions. These questions and Staff's corresponding answers are as follows:

Question 1:

If the conditions suggested by the Staff of the Commission are imposed in granting

TracFone Wireless, Inc.'s application and the Company does not comply with those conditions,

can the Commission revoke TracFone's designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier?

Answer 1:

Yes.

TracFone is a commercial mobile radio service (CMRS) provider that provides prepaid wireless telecommunications services. TracFone is a "pure wireless reseller," in that the Company owns no telecommunications facilities, but rather resells services provided by other facilities-based carriers. In the past, in an effort to avoid the "double recovery" of federal universal service support, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) had declined to

extend the designation of Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) to pure resellers, such as TracFone, but had not distinguished its reasoning among various types of federal universal support requested by these carriers.² To be more specific, the FCC had not considered whether providing *only* "Lifeline" and *not* "High Cost" support to a pure wireless reseller would result in a double recovery of federal funding.³

On April 9, 2008, the FCC issued its <u>TracFone ETC Order</u>⁴ in which it conditionally granted the petition of TracFone to be designated as an ETC in New York, Virginia, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Alabama, North Carolina, Tennessee, Delaware, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, and the District of Columbia. The FCC dismissed without prejudice TracFone's petition for ETC designation in the State of Florida, since the Florida Public Service Commission, like that of Missouri, asserts its own jurisdiction over the ETC designations of wireless carriers. Under the <u>TracFone ETC Order</u>, TracFone was designated by the FCC as eligible to receive *only* federal "Lifeline" universal service support in the above-listed states because in those jurisdictions the FCC alone, without state action, grants ETC designation. To be absolutely clear, to Staff's knowledge, this was the first time a pure wireless reseller had been granted ETC status by the FCC.

To date, the federal universal service support which may be received by TracFone has been limited to "Lifeline" support. This distinction is pertinent to answering the question presented by this Commission because while the FCC has provided guidance as the a state commission's authority to revoke or suspend the ETC status of a telecommunications carrier

receiving "High Cost" support, the FCC has provided little explicit guidance as to a state commission's ability or authority to revoke or suspend the status of an ETC receiving only "Lifeline" support. In Staff's opinion, the lack of applicable federal regulation is the result of the newly established "Lifeline-only" designation category and the fact that the designation of a carrier receiving "Lifeline-only" support has not yet warranted revocation.

It is Staff's position that the Commission has the authority to revoke the ETC status of a company that receives only federal "Lifeline" support. TracFone agrees. On August 20, 2009, the Company filed its Response to Order Directing Filing, in which the Company states that "[t]he Commission may revoke any Eligible Telecommunication Carrier ("ETC") for non-compliance with applicable legal requirements, including conditions imposed by the Commission in an order designating a carrier as an ETC."

The conditions which Staff would seek to apply to TracFone are derived from the Commission's lawfully promulgated regulations, to which the Company must adhere in order to comply with federal law. If the Company fails to comply with the applicable regulations, Staff may bring a complaint before the Commission, seeking revocation of the ETC designation. It would be Staff's intent in initiating this process to provide the Company with a full opportunity for notice and a hearing upon the substance of the revocation.

Question 2:

Does TracFone pay into the federal Universal Service Fund?

Answer 2:

Yes. Staff contacted the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) which confirmed that TracFone pays into the federal universal service fund. USAC declined to provide additional information on the payments.

Question 3:

How many other states have granted ETC designation for only low income, prepaid wireless service?

Answer 3:

In order to determine the answer to this question, Staff sent a query to the NARUC Telecommunications Subcommittee list-serve and reviewed various state commission websites: Information was obtained from thirty (30) states and the District of Columbia. The information obtained by Staff is contained in Appendix A, attached hereto, and is summarized as follows:

- Of those jurisdictions that provided information to Staff, eighteen (18) jurisdictions have carriers with low income, prepaid wireless ETC designations. Within these jurisdictions, the following information applies:
- The FCC has granted TracFone ETC designation in eleven (11) jurisdictions that and the second second assert individual jurisdiction over the ETC designations of wireless service with the second the same assets of providers; the same are same as the same and the

- O Six (6) states have granted TracFone ETC designation under the exercise of state authority;
- One (1) state has granted ETC designation to a low-income prepaid wireless company that is not TracFone.
- Five (5) states have granted TracFone ETC designation, with various conditions. A more detailed description of these conditions is contained in Appendix A, attached hereto;
- One (1) state has granted TracFone ETC designation with no conditions;
- Two (2) states indicated they have not received any requests for low income, prepaid wireless ETC designation; and

• One (1) state has rejected its only request, that of TracFone, due to non-ETC related issues with the filing.

Question 4:

Are there any, and if so which, states that have pending application of companies seeking ETC designation for low income, prepaid wireless service?

Answer 4:

Based upon the information that Staff was able to obtain, 12 states have application currently pending for low income, prepaid wireless ETC designations. Those states are:

California, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Nebraska,

Oklahoma, Oregon and Washington. Georgia and Michigan previously granted TracFone ETC designation with certain conditions.

WHEREFORE, Staff submits this Staff Response to Commission Questions for the ACL Commission's information and consideration in this matter.
