ORDER OF IMPLEMENTATION

On December 29, 1989, the Commission issued a Report and Order in Case No. TO-87-131 directing the local exchange companies (LECs) in the State of Missouri to offer an extra-exchange calling program at less than toll rates in exchanges demonstrating a community of interest. This program of extra-exchange calling is called community optional service (COS). In its Report and Order of December 29, 1989, the Commission established that a community of interest is demonstrated when an average of six calls per access line per month are made from the petitioning exchange to the requested exchange and two-thirds of the customers in the petitioning exchange make two or more calls to the requested exchange per month.


The route studied in this case has met these criteria thereby demonstrating a community of interest. The Commission's Staff recommends that the route be implemented. However, the Commission notes it has directed that COS be implemented on this route in Case No. TO-90-183. Therefore, this docket is dismissed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Case No. TO-90-164 be dismissed.

3. That this order shall become effective on the date hereof.
