SECOND BRIEF OF MITG

Comes now the Missouri Independent Telephone Company Group¹ (MITG) and for its second brief regarding Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Southwestern Bell Texas Inc., and Southwestern Bell Telephone, LP's (hereinafter jointly referred to as "Southwestern Bell Telephone Companies") request for Commission approval of corporate restructuring and stock transfer, and files its second brief in response to Commission Order dated December 13, 2001.

In its Order the Commission requested further discussion of (1) whether there is any different oversight over SBC's ability to sell or otherwise dispose of the assets of SWBT the Missouri corporation compared to its ability to sell or otherwise dispose of the assets of SWBT as a Texas limited partnership; (2) whether there is any different oversight over the ability of SWBT the Missouri corporation to sell or otherwise dispose of its assets compared to the ability of SWBT as a Texas limited partnership to sell or otherwise dispose of its assets; and (3) whether there is any different oversight over SBC's ability to sell or otherwise dispose of SWBT the Missouri corporation compared to its ability to sell or otherwise dispose of SWBT as a Texas limited partnership.

The power of the Commission for general supervision of telegraph and telephone companies is set forth in Section 386.320, RSMo 2000. The disposition of assets of a telegraph

or telephone corporation is governed under Section 392.300. Whether the assets of a telephone

company seeking reorganization or transfer are owned by a foreign corporation doing business in

Missouri or a Missouri corporation itself the transaction is still governed by Section 392.300.

Pursuant to Section 392.300 any company seeking transfer or reorganization must first apply to

the Commission for approval.

In its initial application requesting Commission approval of the reorganization the

Southwestern Bell Companies involved in this proceeding stated that they would be

telecommunication companies as described in § 386.020(51), RSMo 2000 and be subject to

Commission jurisdiction as set forth in Chapter 392. In its later filings however the

Southwestern Bell Companies have retreated from this position when it concerns an application

of service authority.

Whether this same strategy will be utilized in any future proceedings before this

Commission, concerning any future sales and disposition of assets is unknown. The citizens of

Missouri, and other telecommunications companies in this state however, should be given every

protection that the Missouri legislature has provided. Requiring Southwestern Bell L.P. to apply

for a Certificate of Service Authority will help prevent future deviations and give the

Commission the oversight and jurisdiction that the legislature intended.
