## ORDER EXTENDING TEMPORARY WAIVER

Issue Date: December 8, 2005 Effective Date: December 8, 2005

On July 28, 2005, the Commission issued, in Case No. TX-2003-0301, its Order Denying Application for Rehearing and Granting a Temporary Waiver. Although Southwestern Bell Telephone, L.P., d/b/a SBC Missouri, had requested a waiver of at least one year, the Commission instead granted a temporary waiver, until September 30, 2005, of a portion of one of the Enhanced Record Exchange rules. Specifically, the Commission granted a waiver of the requirement in 4 CSR 240-29.040(4)(A) that the originating Calling Party Number (CPN) be included in the 11-01-XX billing records for wireless-originated calls. By order issued August 4, 2005, the Commission opened this case, TE-2006-0053, to review SBC Missouri's waiver request. In that order, the Commission also adopted a procedural schedule.

On August 8, 2005, the Commission's Staff filed a Joint Motion of All Parties to Suspend Procedural Schedule. The parties agreed that the temporary waiver should be extended to allow the parties to meet and attempt to resolve this matter in an informal

setting. Accordingly, the parties requested that the temporary waiver be extended from September 30, 2005, until November 30, 2005. By order issued August 12, 2005, the Commission suspended the procedural schedule and extended the waiver from September 30, 2005, to November 30, 2005.

On November 17, 2005, Staff filed a motion on behalf of all parties requesting that the Commission extend that temporary wavier from November 30, 2005, to January 31, 2006. Staff notes that the parties would like the opportunity to hold further discussions in an attempt to resolve this matter in an informal setting. Staff also states that if the parties do not reach an agreement and file a unanimous stipulation and agreement by January 20, 2006, they agree to jointly or separately file proposed procedural schedules. In order to allow the Commission additional time to consider the request, the presiding officer issued an order granting a short extension to the waiver, from November 30, 2005, to December 16, 2005.

On December 7, 2005, SBC Missouri filed a Joint Status Report and Request for Further Extension on behalf of all the parties. SBC Missouri states that the parties held a workshop on this matter on November 30, 2005, and that they are continuing their settlement discussions. The parties therefore renew their request that the temporary waiver be extended until January 31, 2006, and that they be granted additional time, until January 20, 2006, to file a unanimous stipulation or proposed procedural schedule.

Upon review, the Commission finds that a short extension of the waiver, to January 31, 2006, is appropriate. The Commission will remind the parties that since additional requests for extensions may not be granted, the parties must be prepared to file either a unanimous stipulation and agreement or a proposed procedural schedule by January 20, 2006.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the waiver of the requirement in 4 CSR 240-29.040(4)(A), that the originating Calling Party Number (CPN) be included in the 11-01-XX billing records for wireless-originated calls, is extended from December 16, 2005, to January 31, 2006.
- 2. That the parties shall file, no later than January 20, 2006, either a unanimous stipulation and agreement or a proposed procedural schedule.
  - 3. That this order shall become effective on December 8, 2005.
