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1 PROCEEDINGS

- 2 JUDGE REED: This is in the matter of the
- 3 application for approval of the transfer of control of Alltel
- 4 Missouri, Inc. and the transfer of Alltel Communications, Inc.
- 5 Interexchange Service Customer Base, Case No. TM-2006-0272.
- 6 My name is Steve Reed. I'm the Regulatory Law
- 7 Judge assigned to hear this case. This is the prehearing
- 8 conference.
- 9 Let's have entries of appearance beginning with
- 10 the applicant -- or applicants.
- 11 MR. DORITY: Thank you, Judge. Appearing on
- 12 behalf of the applicants, Larry W. Dority, Fischer and Dority,
- 13 PC. Our address is 101 Madison, suite 400, Jefferson City,
- 14 Missouri 65101.
- JUDGE REED: And from Staff?
- MR. MEYER: Good morning. David Meyer on
- 17 behalf of the Staff of the Public Service Commission. Our
- 18 address is PO Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- MR. DANDINO: Good morning, your Honor.
- 20 Michael Dandino, Office of the Public Counsel, Post Office Box
- 21 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102 representing the Office
- 22 of Public Counsel and the public.
- JUDGE REED: Thank you, gentlemen.
- 24 This is a prehearing conference and I
- 25 understand that you all are going to meet afterwards likely

- 1 and discuss some issues, but there were some things that I
- 2 wanted to bring up while we're on the record and everybody's
- 3 here today.
- 4 I think in one of the initial orders that was
- 5 entered by the Commission, Staff was asked to address some
- 6 jurisdictional issues. They filed a pleading January 27th and
- 7 I notice that the applicants did not file any response to
- 8 that, at least within the 10-day period.
- 9 MR. DORITY: Right.
- 10 JUDGE REED: So I would think at this point the
- 11 applicants are acquiescing in that analysis by Staff; is that
- 12 correct?
- 13 MR. DORITY: That's correct, your Honor. I
- 14 believe -- and I'll let Mr. Meyer address it specifically, but
- 15 the Staff's pleading, as it related to the specific
- 16 jurisdictional issues, appeared to be on all fours with the
- 17 applicant's position as we set it forth in our application,
- 18 and as a result, we did not file a responsive pleading.
- 19 The Staff also indicated in that pleading that
- 20 they would be filing a Staff rec pursuant to hopefully an
- 21 agreed-upon schedule that we're going to address off record
- 22 this morning.
- JUDGE REED: All right. Mr. Meyer?
- MR. MEYER: I would agree with that.
- JUDGE REED: Mr. Dandino, anything?

- 1 MR. DANDINO: I have no problem with the
- 2 jurisdictional issue.
- JUDGE REED: In that pleading that Staff filed,
- 4 they addressed, at least to some extent, the issue of the
- 5 applicant's request for waiver of 3.535(1)(a). And near the
- 6 end of that pleading, Staff had suggested the filing of a
- 7 distribution agreement or a summary of that agreement. Maybe
- 8 you all are going to talk about that today --
- 9 MR. DORITY: I believe we will.
- JUDGE REED: -- to try to address what needs to
- 11 be done with regard to that.
- Just so this doesn't get away from me, is there
- 13 any intention by anyone at this time to request a local public
- 14 hearing?
- MR. DANDINO: I don't think so.
- JUDGE REED: Or is it too early to tell?
- MR. DANDINO: I don't think so, but it depends
- 18 on how we can resolve things.
- 19 JUDGE REED: All right. Mr. Dority had filed a
- 20 motion for protective order late yesterday. I think that's
- 21 actually effective as a filing today, as I understand it.
- 22 MR. DORITY: I would ask that if there are no
- 23 objections, if you could go ahead and rule on that from the
- 24 Bench. We do have some data request responses that I went
- 25 ahead and offered the NP versions to Staff last evening and

- 1 would like to go ahead and get the proprietary version in
- 2 their hands this morning. So I guess if there are no
- 3 objections, if the Judge would be willing to rule on it, that
- 4 might expedite things.
- 5 JUDGE REED: Mr. Meyer, have you seen the
- 6 motion or do you need to see it?
- 7 MR. MEYER: I've seen the filing. I assume it
- 8 is no different than the last ones that I've seen, so that's
- 9 fine.
- MR. DORITY: Right.
- 11 JUDGE REED: So you would have no objection to
- 12 granting the motion for protective order?
- MR. MEYER: That is correct.
- MR. DANDINO: And I have no objection.
- 15 JUDGE REED: All right. Very good. Then what
- 16 I'll do is I'll put in writing that order granting protective
- 17 order and I'll do that this afternoon, but it's effective as
- 18 of now on the record.
- MR. DORITY: Okay.
- JUDGE REED: And I guess you guys will address
- 21 the issue of the Staff recommendation or an upcoming status
- 22 report?
- MR. MEYER: Correct.
- 24 JUDGE REED: And you'll let me know what you
- 25 want to do with regard to that. Is Staff then going to file

- 1 some sort of schedule?
- 2 MR. MEYER: That's what I was anticipating,
- 3 some type of proposed procedural schedule to get this ready
- 4 for Commission determination.
- 5 JUDGE REED: I guess if Staff can have a
- 6 recommendation within 30 days or so to give me a report, put
- 7 that in the schedule.
- 8 That's all I could see really that I wanted to
- 9 address at this stage of the prehearing conference. Is there
- 10 anything else you guys have?
- 11 MR. DORITY: I just wanted to thank you, Judge,
- 12 for allowing us to participate by teleconference this morning.
- 13 Mr. Steve Rowell with Alltel in Little Rock, Arkansas is
- 14 participating via the teleconference and we appreciate you
- 15 making those arrangements.
- I also appreciate the Staff and OPC's
- 17 willingness to address this matter as expeditiously as they
- 18 have. We are responding to some existing data requests that
- 19 Staff has propounded at this point. As you noted, we hope to
- 20 discuss off line this morning a proposed procedural schedule
- 21 to try to get this issue revolved as quickly as possible.
- 22 In some preliminary discussions with Staff,
- 23 they had suggested that it might be helpful to supplement the
- 24 record with some pre-filed testimony on behalf of the
- 25 applicants and that's something that we're certainly willing

- 1 to visit with them about this morning and get that done as
- 2 quickly as we can.
- 3 As I understand it then, the Staff and the
- 4 Office of Public Counsel would be filing a recommendation on
- 5 an-agreed upon date. We would then have the opportunity to
- 6 respond. And I think the only thing remaining at that point
- 7 would be an on-the-record presentation and we'll look at some
- 8 dates for possibly suggesting a date to the Commission for
- 9 that.
- 10 So, again, you know, we appreciate the Staff's
- 11 diligence and the Office of Public Counsel to date. And I
- 12 would guess that we could have a proposed procedural schedule
- 13 filed with the Commission within a week to 10 days.
- 14 MR. MEYER: Yes. I would say maybe next
- 15 Wednesday.
- JUDGE REED: Okay.
- MR. MEYER: Seems to be common to give us a
- 18 week from the prehearing.
- 19 JUDGE REED: Is there anything else that you
- 20 have, Mr. Meyer?
- MR. MEYER: That's all we have.
- JUDGE REED: Mr. Dandino?
- MR. DANDINO: I have nothing further.
- JUDGE REED: Well, I'm finished. We'll go off
- 25 the record then.
