Andrew. This is what came back to me from the experts: On September 1, the US District Court judge granted SBC's Motion for Preliminary Injunction concerning the M2A successor ICAs, pursuant to a Consent Stipulation regarding that motion.

The PSC's Arbitration Order and related orders concerning successor ICAs are enjoined to the extent they require SBC MO to fill new orders for ULS or UNE-P under TA96. The injunction is effective immediately concerning new ULS and UNE-P, and it is effective October 7, 2005, as to orders to add lines or move lines for existing CLEC customers.

SBC MO is still required to provide service to embedded base ULS/UNE-P customers pursuant to FCC rules, and CLECs may obtain additions or deletions of switch features for existing customers at existing locations.

Hi, Andrew. Per our telephone conversation a few minutes ago regarding the Missouri Injunction Order, here are the basics of what the LSR process will be:

For purposes of the LSR ordering process for ordering in the state of Missouri, when adding additional lines for existing UNE-P customers and moving to new locations, effective September 2, 2005, CLECs must follow the process outlined below when submitting LSRs to request new inward ordering activity for a CLEC's end user UNE-P account.

For REQ TYP = M, F, U, V, W or X and ACT = N, V or C with LNA=N:

- \* SC must = MO
- \* Project code of TRROMO must exist on the LSR in the PROJECT field of the LSR page.
- \* Entry of "UNEP" followed by an existing telephone number (TN) of UNE-P account in the REMARKS field of the LSR page (valid formats: UNEP nnnnnnnnnn or UNEP nnn-nnn-nnnn) where the TN is 10 numeric characters and hyphens are optional. The placement of UNEP followed by a space and then the TN must be the last remark entry on the LSR.

The process for outside move activity (ACT=T) will continue to follow the same order process and LSR business rules that existed prior to March 11, 2005. No project information will be required for outside move orders because an existing end user account for UNE-P is already a prerequisite for the LSR to be accepted by SBC Missouri.

It is not necessary for CLECs submitting LSRs requesting new inward or outside move ordering activities for an existing CLEC's end user UNE-P account to perform the Impairment Status Inquiry function in Verigate. The Impairment Status Inquiry only reflects the requirements for new inward activities for a brand new end user customer. Please ignore the Impairment Status Inquiry response if you choose to validate ordering capabilities for an existing end user.

SBC Missouri will review LSRs for these activities during this period. If CLECs do not follow the above process, the following existing edits would be triggered - "IF0307/IF0308 LSR - CC/LSPAETH Unbundled Local Switching cannot be ordered".

Re: Notice of Transition of the FCC TRO Remand Order Declassified UNEs

Dear Ann Shafer:

As SBC communicated on July 1, 2005, via Accessible Letter CLECALL05-112 (copy attached), approximately 25% of the transition period defined by the FCC has elapsed. As you know, the FCC's TRO Remand Order ("Order") became effective on March 11, 2005. Among other things, the order eliminated unbundling requirements for mass market local switching, DS1 and DS3 loops, DS1 and DS3 transport and dark fiber loop and transport.

Your SBC Industry Markets Local Account Manager will be contacting you to assist you in making an orderly transition of the embedded base of elements no longer required to be provided under Section 251 of the Act. To the extent that you have not already amended your ICA(s) to reflect the modifications necessary to comply with the FCC's Order and to the extent you have not completed your transition to an alternate service arrangement or disconnected the affected elements, SBC requests that you finalize your plans to do so as soon as possible. Again, your SBC Industry Markets Local Account Manager stands ready to assist you in these endeavors. SBC believes it is imperative that your transition plan take into account the SBC service order and due date guidelines and that your requested service order due dates are practical. This will help to ensure continuity of end-user customer services and, more importantly, to ensure that those customers maintain access to essential services such as 911 service.

Your SBC Industry Markets Local Account Manager will be working directly with you to ensure the actions necessary to amend your ICA and facilitate the transition are taken during the remainder of the FCC's transition period. To avoid any further delay, SBC is requesting that you provide the following to me within 30 days of the date of Accessible Letter CLECALL05-112:

1. A signed Mass Market Unbundled Local Switching/UNE-P Amendment and/or
2. A signed High-Capacity Loop and Transport Amendment or a red-lined version of either of these Amendment(s) identifying any modifications you propose. These Amendments can be accessed via CLEC On-line via <https://clec.sbc.com/clec>.
3. Your Company's Transition Plans by network element (i.e., ULS/UNE-P, DS1 and DS3 Loops, DS1 and DS3 Transport, Dark Fiber Loops and Dark Fiber Transport) including:
  - month-over-month volumes that will be transitioned or disconnected by State;
  - the alternative arrangement to which each network element, or category of network elements, will be transitioned to by month and State.

I realize that you may not have formulated a final transition plan; however, it is imperative that you do so in the very near future to ensure continuity of service for your end users.
