STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff), by and through one of its attorneys, and for its Recommendation states the following:

1, On April 28, 2000, J D Services, Inc., a Utah corporation (JDS Utah), and J D Services, Inc., a Nevada corporation (JDS Nevada), filed a joint application requesting Commission approval for the acquisition by merger of JDS Utah by JDS Nevada. JDS Nevada survives the merger with JDS Utah. JDS Utah was issued a certificate to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications in Missouri in Case No. TA-96-131. JDS Nevada has also filed a request for a certificate of authority to provide interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri in Case No. TA-2000-698.



- 2. The standard for approval of a merger is that the merger will not be detrimental to the public interest. See, <u>In the Matter of the Application of WorldCom. Inc. and MFS Communications Company</u>, <u>Inc. for Approval and Plan of Merger</u>, and <u>Related Transactions</u>, 5 Mo. P.S.C. 3d 312, 315 (1996).
- 3. Both of the applicants described above requested that the Commission cancel the Certificate of JDS Utah in the event the Commission approves the merger between JDS Utah and JDS Nevada.
- 4. In the attached Memorandum, which is labeled Appendix A, the Staff summarizes its review of the application and recommends that the Commission issue an Order which:
 - A. Approves the merger between JDS Utah and JDS Nevada.
 - B. Cancels the certificate of JDS Utah.
 - C. Issues an Order with an effective date that coincides with any Commission action or approval that may occur in Case No.TA-2000-698 (Approval of Certificate JDS Nevada).

On April 28, 2000, J D Services, Inc., a Utah corporation, (JDS Utah) and JD Services Inc, a Nevada corporation (JDS Nevada) (together Applicants) filed an application requesting that the Commission issue an Order granting authorization for the acquisition by merger of JDS Utah by JDS Nevada. On April 28, 2000 JDS Nevada also filed a request for a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange telecommunications services, assigned Case No. TA-2000-698. JDS Nevada proposes to adopt the current filed tariff of JDS Utah and that the current certificate of JDS Utah be withdrawn. JDS Utah was issued its certificate to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services on November 29, 1995 in Case No. TA-96-131. Both companies are presentlyl authorized to use the d/b/a American Freedom Network.

In accordance with 4 CSR 240.2060(5) and (6) Parties state that the proposed merger will have no impact on the tax revenues of any political subdivision in Missouri, and that there are no pending actions or final unsatisfied judgments or decisions from any state or federal agency or court involving customer service or rates. According to 4 CSR 240-2.060(3) competitively classified companies are exempt from providing certain information such as public interest information in applications to merge, consolidate or sell/transfer assets. Based on the limited information provided to Staff, Staff does not believe the transaction will be detrimental to the public interest. Any transaction, solely involving competitively classified companies, is not detrimental to the public interest since a customer can freely switch to another provider.

Telecommunications Department Staff (Staff) has reviewed JDS Nevada application for certificate of authority (TA-2000-698) to provide interexchange telecommunications services and finds it meets the Commission's statutory requirements. Staff has no objection to JDS Nevada's adoption JDS Utah's interexchange tariff PSC No 1. Furthermore Staff has no objection to the Commission granting approval of the merger between JDS Utah and JDS Nevada and discontinuing the interexchange certificate of JDS Utah.
