ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE AND TARIFFS

This order cancels the certificate of service authority and tariffs of United Systems Access Telecom, Inc.

On March 28, 2005, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission moved to cancel the certificate of service authority and tariffs of United Systems Access Telecom, Inc. ("USAT"). In support thereof, Staff stated that USAT, of Kennebunk, Maine, had requested by letter of September 14, 2004, that its Missouri certificate and tariffs be cancelled. Staff stated further that this Commission granted USAT an IXC certificate and approved its tariffs on April 24, 2000, in Case No. TA-2002-239; that it currently has no customers in Missouri and no longer plans to provide any services in this state; that it has no pending actions or unsatisfied judgments against it, arising within the past three years, involving customers service or rates; and that it has no overdue Annual Reports or unpaid Commission assessments.

The Commission will grant the requested relief and cancel USAT's certificate and tariff.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- That the Motion to Open Case and Cancel Certificate of Service Authority,
 filed on March 28, 2005, by the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission is granted.
- 2. That the certificate of service authority granted to United Systems Access Telecom, Inc., in Case No. TA-2002-239 is cancelled.
- 3. That the tariff of United Systems Access Telecom, Inc., MO PSC Tariff No. 1, approved in Case No. TA-2002-239, is cancelled.
 - 4. That this order shall become effective on May 1, 2005.
 - 5. That this case may be closed on May 2, 2005.
