UTILICORP NETWORKS CANADA AND TRANSALTA CORP. CLOSE DEAL

CALGARY, Alberta, August 31, 2000 -- UtiliCorp Networks Canada, a unit of U.S.-based UtiliCorp United (NYSE:UCU), today announced the financial closing of the purchase of TransAlta Corporation's Alberta electricity distribution and retail businesses. Regulatory approval was granted by the Alberta Energy and Utilities Board in July.

The approximately CA\$700 million (US\$480 million) purchase was announced in February and involves 350,000 retail customers, the management and operation of 90,000 kilometers (54,000 miles) of low-voltage power distribution lines, and a 24-hour customer call center in Calgary.

"The closing is an important milestone, representing quality, professional effort by both companies," said Robert W. Holzwarth, Calgary-based CEO of UtiliCorp's Canadian operations. "We anticipate now being able to move quickly to discuss our plans for the future with our employees and customers."

Alberta began the process of deregulating wholesale electricity with the passage of the Electric Utility Act in 1995. A 1998 amendment to the act moved the province further along the path to deregulation by allowing retail customers to choose among competitive electricity suppliers beginning January 1, 2001.

The other Canadian utility operation of UtiliCorp United is West Kootenay Power, an integrated electric utility with headquarters in Trail, British Columbia. Aquila Canada, UtiliCorp United's wholesale energy marketing and trading arm for all of Canada, also is located in Calgary.

UtiliCorp United is a Kansas City, Missouri-based multinational energy company with about 4 million customers. It operates in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Spain, Germany, Norway, New Zealand and Australia. At June 30, 2000,

UtiliCorp had CA\$13 billion (US \$8.8 billion) in assets and 12-month sales of CA\$31.6 billion (US\$21.4 billion).

TransAlta is an international electric energy company with more than CA\$6 billion (US\$4.1 billion) in assets. The company is focused on achieving strong earnings growth, enhancing its competitive edge as a low-cost operator of generation and transmission assets, and developing gas-fired independent power projects. The company is concentrating its growth in Canada, the United States, Australia and Mexico. TransAlta owns and operates more than 8,000 megawatts of generation plus significant transmission assets in Alberta.
