NOTICE OF DISMISSAL

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff"), through the undersigned counsel, and hereby respectfully submits this *Notice of Dismissal*:

- 1. On April 15, 2020, the Commission granted Elm Hills Utility Operating Company, Inc.'s ("Elm Hills") request to acquire all or substantially all of the assets Central Rivers Wastewater Utility, Inc. ("Central Rivers") used to provide retail sewer utility services, including its certificates of convenience and necessity ("CCN"), in Case No. SM-2020-0146. The Commission ordered Elm Hills to pay the delinquent FY20 Commission assessment of \$1,009.31 no later than 30 days after Elm Hills had closed on the Central Rivers assets.
- 2. On July 1, 2020, Elm Hills filed notice with the Commission that it had closed on the assets of Central Rivers on June 30, 2020. Per Commission order, Elm Hills had until July 30, 2020 to pay the delinquent assessment.

- 3. On September 10, 2020, the Commission received a payment of \$1,009.31, which covered the delinquent FY20 Commission assessment owed by Central Rivers.
- 4. On September 29, 2020, the Commission received a payment of \$1,040.73 from Elm Hills, which covered the delinquent FY21 Commission assessment owed by Central Rivers.
- 5. Elm Hills has now paid the entirety of the delinquent assessments owed by Central Rivers.
- 6. Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.116 governs the dismissal of cases brought before the Commission. Since no prepared testimony has been filed, or oral evidence offered, Staff may dismiss its case against Central Rivers voluntarily, without an order from the Commission.¹
- 7. Thus, Staff provides notice of dismissal of its complaint against Central Rivers.

WHEREFORE, Staff respectfully submits this Notice of Dismissal.
