Dear Judge Woodruff,

With this letter Teleport Communications America, LLC ("Teleport"), an affiliate of AT&T Corp., has filed an application seeking the Commission's review and reversal of the North American Number Plan Thousands-Block Pooling Administrator's decision concerning a request for telephone numbers to serve St. Luke's Primary Care facility in Clinton, Missouri.

Pursuant to Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.135(2)(B), we have designated and filed Exhibit E to this application as "Confidential" because it contains very competitively sensitive information not available to the public in any format. This exhibit, the FCC Form U1 of Form 502 for the Clinton, Missouri rate center, shows the number of AT&T Missouri retail residential and business access lines by NPA-NXX within the rate center.

Access line information disaggregated in this fashion reveals the number of access lines a carrier serves on a very specific and localized geographic or market segment basis. This internal market-share information has been developed at great expense and is closely guarded by all carriers. If made public, this type of information would make carriers more vulnerable to the marketing efforts of their competitors. As a result, access line information at this level of detail is kept confidential by carriers in the industry and is not available to the public in any format.

Accordingly, this information falls squarely within the "Confidential" classification of 4 CSR 240-2.135(2)(A)(3): "marketing analysis or other market-specific information relating to services offered in competition with others."

TELEPORT'S APPLICATION

Teleport Communications America, LLC ("Teleport"), an affiliate of AT&T Corp., respectfully requests¹ the Commission issue an Order reviewing and reversing Somos'² denial of 100 consecutive numbers Teleport requested to meet Saint Luke's Health System telecommunications needs at its Primary Care facility in Clinton, Missouri.

In support of this Application, Teleport states:

1. Teleport is a Delaware limited liability company with headquarters at One AT&T Way, Bedminster, New Jersey 07921. It may be contacted at the regular and electronic mail addresses and telephone and facsimile numbers of its attorneys, as set out under the signature block of this Application. Teleport is authorized to do business in Missouri.³ Teleport is a "local exchange telecommunications company" and a "public utility," and is duly authorized to provide

"telecommunications service" within the State of Missouri, as each of those phrases is defined in Section 386.020, RSMo.⁴

3. Saint Luke's Health System, at its Primary Care facility in the Clinton area, has migrated to B-VoIP and would like to add 100 DID numbers in the format 660-XX4-72XX such that they integrate into the existing network in the Kansas City metro area. This location has had outdated equipment and could not provide DID service until now. (*See Exhibit A*). The Industry pool currently has 660-924-7000 available but 660-924-7200 is contaminated by 1 number. In the spirit of number conservation and to activate service quicker, Saint Luke's Health System has agreed to take the contaminated block even if they only receive 99 available numbers.

4. Teleport has researched the available numbering resources in the Clinton rate center and has determined that it cannot meet the customer's needs. Teleport has 660-869-4 with ~900 numbers but that does not meet their requested format of 660-XX4-72XX.

5. Consequently, Teleport requests that the Commission grant it numbering resources consisting of one (1) thousands block.

6. On June 27, 2019 Teleport submitted a thousands-block Application Form, Part 1A, for the numbering resources assignment necessary to meet Saint Luke's needs (*Exhibit B*). Teleport completed the Application in accordance with the Industry Numbering Committee's

Thousands-Block Pooling Assignment Guidelines and completed the necessary Months-to-Exhaust and Utilization Certification Worksheet (Exhibit C).

7. On June 27, 2019, Somos denied the request on the grounds that Teleport had not met the months-to-exhaust or utilization thresholds. (Exhibit D)

8. Teleport respectfully asks the Commission to overturn Somos' decision to withhold numbering resources. This Commission has overturned the North American Numbering Plan Administrator's decision to withhold numbering resources in several cases and Teleport respectfully submits that it should likewise do so here.

9. Under existing procedures, Somos has asserted that it is required to accept or reject an application for resources based solely on FCC criteria. However, the FCC's March 31, 2000, Order in its Number Resource Optimization docket states that a carrier may challenge a resource denial before the appropriate state regulatory commission and a state commission may choose to affirm or overturn Somos' decision to withhold numbering resources.⁵ Thus, the Commission has the authority to "affirm or overturn" Somos' decision to withhold numbering resources from the carrier "based on its determination of compliance with the reporting and numbering resource application requirements herein."⁶ Moreover, the FCC determined that states may overturn Somos' decision to withhold numbering resources from the carrier where there is a verifiable need for the carrier to satisfy a specific customer request:

We also agree with WinStar that a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request. We therefore clarify that states may also grant relief if a carrier demonstrates that it has received a customer request for

numbering resources in a given rate center that it cannot meet with its current inventory.⁷

10. The FCC further explained in its March 31, 2000, Order that a “[c]arrier may demonstrate such a need by providing the state with documentation of the customer request and current proof of the utilization in the rate center” and that states “may grant requests for customers seeking contiguous blocks of numbers.”⁸ Moreover, although the FCC declined to establish a specific timeframe for states to act on these requests, the FCC indicated “in most instances, 10 business days from receipt of request that the state determines to be sufficiently detailed and complete will be sufficient time to review and act upon safety valve requests.”⁹

11. Further, this Application complies with 4 CSR 240-28.016(1). Teleport has attached hereto its “Months-to-Exhaust Worksheet” indicating the month-to-exhaust in the Clinton rate center encompassing both the preceding six months and projected monthly utilization for the next twelve months. 4 CSR 240-28.016(1)(A). (Exhibit C). Teleport has also attached hereto its most recently-filed FCC Form U1 of Form 502 for this rate center. 4 CSR 240-28.016(1)(B). (Exhibit E - Confidential). Finally, Teleport attaches copies of its originally-filed request to Somos (i.e., its Thousands-Block Application Form, Part 1A and Somos’ denial of that request. 4 CSR 240-28.016(1)(C). (Exhibits B and D, respectively). These materials and the instant Application demonstrate a verifiable need for the numbering resources requested herein. In connection with this request, Teleport has exhausted all other available remedies designed to conserve numbering resources. 4 CSR 240-28.016(1)(D).

12. Teleport has no final unsatisfied judgments or decisions against it from any state or federal agency or court which involve Missouri retail customer service or rates, which action, judgment or decision has occurred within three (3) years of the date of this Application.

13. Teleport does not have any annual report or assessment fees that are overdue in Missouri.

14. Saint Luke's has explained that these numbers are needed in order to add additional DIDs for its Primary Care facility in Clinton.

WHEREFORE, Teleport respectfully requests that the Commission overturn Somos's previous determination in this matter and instruct Somos to release the numbering resources described herein.

Please accept this Letter of Intent requesting additional numbering resources. Saint Luke's Health System requests 100 consecutive numbers in the Clinton rate center.

Saint Luke's Health System is a non-profit hospital network in the bi-state Kansas City metro area, located in northeast Kansas and northwest Missouri. With over 12,000 local employees, Saint Luke's Health System is the third largest private employer in the Kansas City metro.

PSTN connection for Saint Luke's Medical Group located at 603 E Gaines Dr, Clinton, MO was recently migrated to BVOIP over SIP trunk. Due to an outdated CO equipment this location had never been able to utilize DID service. We would like to provide it at this time. Given this is a service expansion project we will not be returning our existing numbers.

This facility is also part of a larger voice network that utilizes approximately 20,000 DID numbers from different Central Office locations across the greater Kansas City metro area.

SLHS has requested AT&T for additional 100 DID numbers and was provided with the only 100 DID block of consecutive numbers that are in conflict with our existing greater Kansas City Metro hospital 5 digit dialing plan therefore, specific DNs are being requested in order to fit into this large dialing plan.

The Safety Valve Request is for 100 consecutive DID range in 660-XX4-72XX format if possible. DID range in 660-XXX-72XX format will be less preferable, but acceptable.

Pending AT&T's successful completion of testing, Saint Luke's Health System understands these numbers will need to be activated within 180 days of the effective date.
