- certificate to provide interexchange telecommunications services.
 - certificate to provide local exchange telecommunications services.*
- *local exchange authority should be restricted to dedicated, private line services.

Staff recommends the applicant receive competitive classification. Furthermore, Staff recommends approval of the applicant's proposed tariff, PSC MO NO. 1, with a proposed effective date of August 30, 1999 **or expedited to August 20, 1999** if possible. In addition, Staff recommends approval of the waivers listed in the Notice.

Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a Iamo Long Distance filed a Motion to Expedite Application and Tariff Approval or to Grant Interim Authority and Approval on July 15, 1999, the same date that it filed its application for certificate of service authority. The Commission issued a Notice of Applications on July 27, 1999 which set an intervention deadline of August 11, 1999. On July 30, 1999, AT&T Communications of the Southwest Inc. filed an Application to Intervene and Motion to Consolidate. On August 3, 1999, the Commission issued its Order Consolidating Cases and Directing Answer which orders a response from Staff and Fiber Four Corporation. Both the Staff and Fiber Four Corporation filed their responses on August 9, 1999.

On June 25, 1999, Fiber Four Corporation (FFC) filed an intrastate long distance message telecommunications service (toll) tariff with the Commission proposing differing rates based upon the local exchanges where the service was to be provided. Included with the tariff were certified copies of fictitious name registrations for Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a Rock Port Long Distance, Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a Holway Long Distance, Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a KLM Long Distance and Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a Iamo Long Distance. The Commission's Records Personnel informed FFC of its intention to reject the tariff because it proposed service under multiple fictitious names. On July 2, 1999, FFC submitted a Motion to Reinstate and Approve Tariff Filing for an Interim Period of Time (Case No. TO-2000-5). That Motion included a proposed tariff which listed FFC with four different fictitious names. On July 16, 1999, the Telecommunications Department Staff (Staff) filed its recommendation to reject the filing. On July 19, 1999, FFC filed a Motion to Withdraw its filing and then on July 21, 1999, the Commission issued its Notice Closing Case. On July 15, 1999, FFC filed four separate applications, one for each fictitious name under which it proposed to do business (Case Nos. TA-2000-23, TA-2000-24, TA-2000-25 and TA-2000-27).

On April 22, 1999, Iamo Telephone Company (Iamo) filed its petition with the Commission seeking approval of its proposed intraLATA dialing parity (ILDPA) plan. The Commission assigned the petition Case No. TO-99-509. In the petition Iamo states that FFC, an affiliate interexchange carrier certified by this Commission in Case No. TA-96-376, would be the default intraLATA toll carrier in the event Iamo's customers fail to select an intraLATA toll carrier. FFC's tariff approved in Case No. TA-96-376 does not contain intraLATA toll services.

The Commission approved the ILDPA plan, with modifications, on June 10, 1999. One modification was to alter the customer notice to state that the default intraLATA toll carrier would be an affiliate of Iamo Telephone Company. The Commission also extended the intraLATA dialing parity date from July 22, 1999 to August 20, 1999. If the Commission does not approve Fiber Four Corporation d/b/a Iamo Long Distance's application and tariff prior to August 20, 1999, Iamo customers who have not selected a primary intraLATA toll carrier (PIC) may be without "1+" intraLATA toll service. This is the primary reason Staff recommends expedited approval of the application and tariff by August 20, 1999.
