STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOR APPROVAL OF TARIFF REVISIONS

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, by and through counsel, and for its Recommendation for Approval of Tariff Revisions states to the Missouri Public Service Commission the following:

- 1. Argyle Estates Water Supply ("Company") initiated the subject small company rate increase request ("Request") by submitting a letter to the Secretary of the Commission, which was stamped "Received" at the Commission's offices on June 18, 2001. The Company submitted its Request under the provisions of the Commission's Small Company Rate Increase Procedure, which is found at 4 CSR 240-2.200.
- 2. Consistent with the Small Company Rate Increase Procedure, the Staff and the Company have negotiated and executed an Agreement Regarding Disposition of Small Company Rate Increase Request ("Company/Staff Disposition Agreement") regarding the Company's Request.
- 3. On February 4, 2002, the Company filed proposed tariff revisions with the Commission for the purpose of implementing the provisions of the above-referenced Company/Staff Disposition Agreement, and the instant case was established. Consistent with the

Small Company Rate Increase Procedure, the Company also filed the Company/Staff Disposition Agreement along with its proposed tariff revisions.

- 4. On February 25, 2002, the Office of the Public Counsel ("OPC") filed its recommendation in this case, wherein it stated that OPC " ... agrees with the proposed agreement between the Commission Staff and Argyle Estates Water Supply, regarding a rate increase."
- 5. In the attached Memorandum, which is labeled Appendix A, the Staff recommends that the Commission issue an order approving the Company's proposed tariff revisions, to be effective for service rendered on and after March 22, 2002.
- 6. The Commission has the authority to approve the subject proposed tariff revisions in accordance with Sections 393.140(11) and 393.150, RSMo 2000. In addition, Section 393.130.1, RSMo 2000 provides that all charges made by any water corporation for water service rendered or to be rendered shall be "just and reasonable." The Staff's and the OPC's reviews of, and agreement with, the proposed rate increase establish that the charges contained in the revised tariff sheets are "just and reasonable," as that statute requires.
- 7. The procedure followed in this case complies with the requirements of the Small Company Rate Increase Procedure in general, and with 4 CSR 240-2.200(1)(D) in particular.

WHEREFORE, the Staff respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order approving the Company's proposed tariff revisions, to be effective for service rendered on and after March 22, 2002, consistent with its recommendations contained in the attached Memorandum.

Background

Argyle Estates Water Supply (Company) initiated the subject small company rate increase request (Request) by its submittal of a letter to the Secretary of the Commission that was received at the Commission's offices on June 18, 2001 (see Attachment A). The Company submitted its Request under the provisions of Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.200, Small Company Rate Increase Procedure (the informal rate case procedure).

By its Request, the Company was asking for Commission approval of customer rates intended to generate an increase of \$5,700 in its total annual water service operating revenues. The Company provides water service to approximately 49 regulated water service customers.

Upon review and acceptance of the Company's Request, personnel in the Commission's Data Center assigned Tariff File No. 2001 01195 to the Request for purposes of identification and tracking, and forwarded the Request to the Commission's Water & Sewer Department for processing under the informal rate case procedure.

By a letter dated July 13, 2001, which the Water & Sewer Department Staff had previously approved, the Company notified its customers of the Request (see Attachment B). As a part of this notice, the Company requested that its customers' questions or comments be directed to the Commission Staff and/or the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC).

Staff's Investigation

As noted at the beginning of this Memorandum, Staff members from the Accounting, Engineering & Management Services, Financial Analysis and Water & Sewer Departments participated in the Staff's review of the Company's Request. All Staff participants, and all of their respective up-line supervisors, were given the opportunity to review and comment on this Memorandum prior to it being filed. Wendell R. Hubbs of the Water & Sewer Department created the initial draft of this Memorandum and comments received from the reviewers were incorporated therein for creation of this final version of the Memorandum.

In response to the customer notice dated July 13, 2001, the Staff received four customer contacts by letter. All of these contacts are of the opinion that the requested increase is excessive. OPC received one letter that the Commission Staff did not. The customer letters received by both the OPC and the Staff have been placed in a "letter file" in the case papers. To date Staff has received one customer response to the second notice; Staff will update the "letter file" for this and any subsequent customer contacts.

Based upon its audit of the Company's books and records, an evaluation of the Company's depreciation rates and an analysis of the Company's capital structure and cost of capital, the Staff concluded that the Company could justify a net increase of \$5,433 (approximately a 58.9% increase) in its annual water service operating revenues. Pursuant to discussions with the Staff, an <u>Agreement Regarding Disposition of Small Company Rate Increase Reguest</u> (Disposition Agreement) was reached between the Company and the Staff. This Agreement and the proposed tariff sheets have previously been filed in this case.

The Disposition Agreement contained the following agreements regarding the Company's operating revenues, customer rates and service charges:

(1) that an increase of \$5,433 (approximately 58.9%) in the Company's annual water revenues is reasonable; (2) that the depreciation rates set out on Attachment A to the agreement should be the prescribed depreciation rates for the Company; (3) that the addition of a "Late Payment Charge" is reasonable; (4) that the addition of a "Bad Check Charge" of \$15 per bad check is reasonable; (5) that the addition of a "Meter Test Charge" of \$30 for all tests after

the first one in any 12 month period is reasonable; (6) that the addition of a "Connection Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (7) that the addition of a "Door Collection Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (8) that the addition of an "Emergency Call Out Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (9) that increasing the "Tap-on Fee" from \$50 to \$100 is reasonable; and (10) that replacing the "Reconnection Charge" for tariff rule violations of \$5, with a "Disconnect turn-off charge" of \$15 and a Reconnect turn-on charge" of \$15 is reasonable.

Regarding the above agreements, the Staff determined that the miscellaneous charge portion of the Company's tariff needed to be updated and therefore proposed items (3) through (10).

In addition to the above agreements regarding the Company's revenues, rates and charges, the Disposition Agreement also contained the following agreements:

(1) that the Company will list its business telephone number and its emergency service number on all of its quarterly bills; (2) that the Company will print the payment due date on all of its quarterly bills; (3) that the Company will keep a "customer contact log", whereby the company will maintain for a three year period all customer complaints and inquiries, including details regarding the type of contact and its resolution; (4) that the Company will obtain a fireproof file cabinet to keep utility documents stored; and (5) that the Company will install a master meter and take meter readings from it on a monthly basis.

Copies of the Staff's revenue requirement accounting run (as used in the revenue requirement analysis) and rate design worksheets are contained in Attachment C.

The tariff sheets (see Attachment E) that the Company filed, which resulted in the

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creation of this case, contain rates designed to generate the agreed-upon additional operating revenues.

Responses to Staff's Recommendations and Subsequent Actions

Staff was notified by telephone by Ruth O'Neill of the OPC that OPC believed that a second customer notice should be sent to consumers. Attachment D hereto is a copy of the second notice that was sent to the Company's customers explaining the Staff's recommendation.

As evidenced by its filing of the Disposition Agreement and tariff sheets, the Company agrees, at this time, with the Staff's recommended increase of \$5,433 in the Company's annual operating water revenues.

By a letter, which was stamped "received" by personnel in the Data Center on February 4, 2002 (see Attachment E), the Company submitted to the Commission two revised tariff sheets including proposed rates and charges reflecting the terms of the Company/Staff Disposition Agreement. Consistent with the informal rate case procedure, the subject tariff sheets bear an effective date of March 22, 2002, which is more than 45 days past the issue date. The filing of those revised tariff sheets resulted in the creation of this case. Additionally, as is required by the informal rate case procedure, the Company included a copy of the Disposition Agreement with its tariff filing.

Staff's Recommendations

Based upon the above, the Staff recommends that the Commission issue an order in this case that: (1) approves the revised tariff sheets that the Company filed on February 4, 2002, to be effective for service rendered on and after March 22, 2002; (2) prescribes the depreciation rates set out on Attachment A to the Disposition Agreement as those authorized for the Company; (3) approves the terms of the Disposition Agreement; and (4) directs the Company to comply with the terms of the Disposition Agreement.

Dear Mr. Roberts,

This letter is to serve as my request for a rate increase for the Argyle Estates Water Supply, under the Commissions procedure for small companies and in compliance with the Commission's requirements.

This rate increase is of utmost urgency and is imperative to the economic viability and soundness of the water system at this time.

I am requesting additional annual operating revenue in the amount of \$5,700.00. Since billing is done on a quarterly basis, this would amount to increased revenue of \$1,425.00 per quarter.

The reasons for the requested increase in revenues are as follows:

- In 1998, electric bills increased by 18% while revenues decreased by 2%. In 1999, electric bills increased by 17% while revenues increased by 8.43%. In 2000, electric bills decreased by 3.785% and revenues were down by 1.9%.
- General overall operating expenses have been increasing each year for the past 5 years due to the age of the water system.
- The addition of a 10,000 gallon storage tank, fast lead pump, phase converter, piping, electrical and all related equipment and work at an approximate cost of \$14,500. This upgrading of the water system is now in progress and is about 50% complete.

All of the Commission's annual assessments have been paid to date.

The current water system annual report, for the year 2000, was filed on time, and is on file with the Commission at this time.

I would appreciate the Commission's prompt response in this matter, as it is crucial to the viability of the water system.

Dear Customer:

On June 18, 2001, Argyle Estates Water Supply (Company) submitted a request for permanent increases in its current water rates, under the Missouri Public Service Commission's (Commission) small company rate increase procedure.

By its request, the Company is seeking an increase in its annual operating water service revenues of \$5,700 (an approximate 59.8% increase). The Company believes this increase in its operating revenues is absolutely necessary to allow it to meet current operating expenses, plus the substantial expenditure for utility plant, which includes a 10,000 gallon storage tank, upgrading electrical system from 200 gmp to 400 gmp service and additional pumping and electrical equipment, (currently under construction).

Set out below is a comparison of the Company's current residential customer quarterly bill and the customer proposed quarterly bill as if they were increased by the requested percentage increase. The following is priced out on a customer using 18,000 gallons per quarter.

Water Rates:

Current Quarterly Rate Bill (for first 6,000 gallons/quarter)	\$23.82

The proposed increase would amount to approximately \$1.95 per week or .27 $3/4\phi$ per day based on a usage of 18,000 gallons.

Beginning sometime soon, the Staff of the Public Service Commission (Commission Staff) will conduct an independent investigation of the books, records and operations of the Company. Based upon that investigation, the Commission Staff will then make its recommendation regarding the Company's rate increase request, and necessary changes to system operations, to the Commission for its consideration.

The Officer of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel), a state agency responsible for representing the interests of the consumer before the Commission, may conduct its own investigation, but at a minimum will review the results of the Commission Staff's investigation. The Public Counsel will then make its own recommendations regarding the Company's rate increase requests, and necessary changes to system operations, to the Commission for its consideration.

Any customer who has questions or comments regarding the Company's rate increase requests, or who has experienced recent service problems, should contact the Commission Staff and the Public Counsel within 30 days of the date of this notice. To do so, please use the addresses, telephone numbers or fax numbers shown below. The Commission Staff and/or the Public Counsel will respond to all such customer contacts, during the course of their investigations.

Regardless of whether the Company sends out a second customer notice, or whether a local public hearing is eventually held, no increase in rates will take effect without the approval of the Public Service Commission.

On June 18, 2001, Argyle Estates Water Supply (Company) submitted a request for permanent increases in its current water rates, under the Missouri Public Service Commission's (Commission) small company rate increase procedure.

By its request, the Company was seeking increases in its customer rates intended to generate an increase in the Company's annual operating revenues for water service of \$5,700. The Company believes these increases in its operating revenues are necessary to meet current operating expenses and to pay for the cost of upgrading the water system.

The improvements to the water system which were completed in 2001, involved the installation of a 10,000 gallon storage tank, 400 amp electrical service, a second phase converter, a fast feed pump, and all related piping, valves, instrumentation and electrical equipment.

As a result of the Company's request, the Staff of the Public Service Commission (Commission Staff) conducted an investigation of the Company's books and records and the Company's operations. Based upon the requests of its investigation, the Commission Staff is recommending an increase in the Company's annual operating water revenues of \$5,433 (approximately 58.9%). The Company has agreed with the Commission Staff's recommended increase in its annual operating revenues.

The Office of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel), a state agency responsible for representing the interests of consumers before the Commission, has reviewed the results of the Commission Staff's investigation. However, the Public Counsel has not yet taken a final position regarding the Commission Staff's recommended increase in the Company's annual operating revenues. Public Counsel is requesting that this second customer notice be sent to all water customers of the Company.

Set out below is a comparison of the Company's current residential customer water rates, and the Commission Staff's recommended customer rates. A quarterly bill comparison, which is based upon an average residential usage of 18,000 gallons every quarter, is also shown.

I am enclosing for filing with the Commission an original and three copies of revised tariff sheets that include rate and language changes reflecting an agreement between the Argyle Estates Water Supply (Company) and the Commission Staff (Staff) on the above subject. The Company initiated the subject rate increase request on June 18, 2001, under the Commission's small company rate increase procedure, and the request was assigned the above-referenced file number.

Additionally, consistent with the Commission's small company rate increase procedure, I am enclosing an Agreement Regarding Disposition of Small Company Rate Increase Request (Agreement). The Agreement reflects a "settlement" between the Company and the Staff regarding all matters related to the Company's water service rate increase request.

The Agreement calls for, and the revised tariff sheets contain, customer rates intended to produce an increase of \$5,433 (an approximate 58.9% increase) in the Company's annual operating revenues for its water operations. Additionally, the revised tariff sheets and Agreement call for implementing new miscellaneous charges and the modification of a previously tariffed miscellaneous charge. The Agreement also requests Commission authorization of the depreciation rates of the Company's water operations.

Also, please note that the Company has consented to the extension of the time period beyond 150 days from the date the letter initiation the procedure was filed with the Commission.

It is my understanding that the Staff will be providing additional information about the Company's rate increase request and the related Staff audit and investigation, for filing in the case papers following the creation of a formal docket.

Agreement Regarding Disposition of Small Company Rate Increase Request

Argyle Estates Water Supply Tariff File No. 2001 01195

Argyle Estates Water Supply (Company) initiated the small company rate increase request (Request) for water service that is the subject of the above-referenced Commission "file" through its submittal of a letter to the Commission's Executive Secretary. The Company submitted its Request under the provisions of Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.200, Small Company Rate Increase Procedure (the informal rate case procedure). The date the Company's letter was received at the Commission's offices was June 18, 2001. In its Request, the Company represented that it was asking for Commission approval of customer rates intended to generate an increase of \$5,700 in its total annual water service operating revenues. The Company provides water service to approximately 49 customers.

Upon review and acceptance of the Company's Request, the Commission's Records Department assigned Tariff File No. 2001 01195 to the Request for purposes of identification and tracking. The Records Department then forwarded the Request to the Commission's Water & Sewer Department for processing under the informal rate case procedure.

Pursuant to the provisions of the informal rate case procedure, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) initiated an audit of the Company's books and records and an inspection of the Company's system and the operation thereof.

Based upon the results of the Staff's audit, the Company and the Staff hereby state their agreement that: (1) an increase of \$5,433 (approximately 58.9%) in the Company's annual water revenues is reasonable; (2) the depreciation rates set out on Attachment A hereto should be the prescribed depreciation rates for the Company, as these were the depreciation rates used by the Staff in its revenue requirement analysis; (3) the addition of a "Late Payment Charge" is reasonable; (4) the addition of a "Bad Check Charge" of \$15 per bad check is reasonable; (5) the addition of a "Meter Test Charge" of \$30 for all tests after the first one in any 12 month period, is reasonable; (6) the addition of a "Connection Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (7) the addition of a "Door Collection Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (8) the addition of an "Emergency Call Out Charge" of \$15 is reasonable; (9) that increasing the "Tap-on Fee" \$50 to \$100 is reasonable; and, (10) that replacing the "Reconnection Charge" for tariff rule violations of \$5, with a "Disconnect turn-off charge" of \$15 and a Reconnect turn-on charge" of 15 is reasonable.

The Company agrees to list its business telephone number and its emergency service number on all of its quarterly bills.

Argyle Estates Water Supply – File No. 2001 01195 Water Small Company Rate Procedure "Agreement"

The Company agrees to print the payment due date on all of its quarterly bills.

The Company agrees to keep a "customer contact log", whereby the company will maintain for a three year period all customer complaints and inquiries. This log will contain detail including the type of contact and its resolution.

The Company agrees to obtain a fireproof file cabinet to keep utility documents stored.

The Company agrees to install a master meter and take meter readings from it on a monthly basis.

Additionally, the Company acknowledges that the Staff will file additional information about the details of its audit with the Commission following the creation of a formal docket.

This Agreement is only between the Company and the Staff. The Office of the Public Counsel (OPC) has verbally notified the Staff that it is requesting a second customer notice be sent to the Company's customers.

Lastly, the Company and the Staff ask the Commission to note that no action need be taken on the Company's tariff sheets until after the Staff files its formal recommendation for approval of the tariff sheet. That filing will take place soon after filing of this Agreement and the revised tariff sheets.

Other than the specific conditions agreed to by the Company, this agreement is a compromise that has resulted from extensive negotiations between Staff and the Company and no party has agreed to any particular ratemaking principal (except those items specifically stated in this agreement) in arriving at the dollar amount.

This Agreement is effective as of the 11th day of January 2002.
