ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATES

On November 24, 2014, the Commission approved a stipulation and agreement whereby Raccoon Creek Utility Operating Company, Inc.'s ("Raccoon Creek") acquisition of the sewer assets of West 16th Street Sewer Company, W.P.C. Sewer Company, and Village Water and Sewer Company, Inc. (the "Acquired Companies") was approved. As part of its order approving the stipulation and agreement, the Commission directed Raccoon Creek to file a notice indicating when the transfer of the sewer systems was complete. Raccoon Creek filed notice on March 20, 2015, indicating that the transfers were completed on March 13, 2015 and March 16, 2015. Because of the transfers, the Acquired Companies are no longer providing sewer service in their certificated service territories. As provided in the order approving the stipulation and agreement, the Commission will now cancel the Acquired Companies' certificates of convenience and necessity.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:


1. West 16th Street Sewer Company's Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide sewer service is canceled.

2. W.P.C. Sewer Company's Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide sewer service is canceled.

3. Village Water and Sewer Company, Inc.'s Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide sewer service is canceled.

4. This order shall be effective when issued.
