


Dear Mr. Nixon:

I am sending information to outline a position Arlie Smith and I have developed regarding refunds for the sewer extension constructed by John Kolisch. It is my understanding from talking to Martin Toma and Roger Phibbs that the building owned by the property owners association is connected to the sewer extension, but has not connected to the water extension. However, I have included information pertaining to the water extension because that matter could arise some time in the future.

The refund for a sewer connection is \$2,783.11 per lot. This is based on construction cost of \$22,950, engineering/surveying cost of \$2,098, and nine (9) lots that could connect directly to the sewer. There are twelve (12) lots abutting the water extension. The engineering/surveying cost is an amount estimated to be three-eighths (3/8) of a total of \$5,595, with another three-eighths (3/8) for water main engineering/surveying, and the remaining one-fourth (1/4) for Mr. Kolisch's building. This is estimated because I do not have a breakdown of the engineering billing. It does not appear to me that any of the construction cost includes the customer-owned service line or service sewer.

If there are any further questions or comments, or if either your company or Mr. Kolisch believe there is a significant error please let me know and I will be happy to re-review this matter. Otherwise I trust that your company, the property owners association, and Mr. Kolisch can finalize this matter.
