ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO MOTION

On April 17, 2015, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion requesting Trans National Communications International, Inc.'s ("Trans National") certificate of service authority and accompanying tariff to provide interexchange and competitive basic local telecommunications service in the State of Missouri be cancelled. The Commission granted Trans National a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange and competitive basic local telecommunications service in the State of Missouri in File Numbers TA-2000-237 and CA-2005-0133.

The Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing.¹ Therefore, if no request for a hearing or objection to Staff's motion is received, the Commission may cancel the certificate based on Staff's motion.

The Commission finds that proper persons shall be allowed 10 days from the issuance of this order to file a motion for hearing.


1. Anyone wishing to respond to Staff's Motion or request a hearing shall do so by filing a pleading no later than April 30, 2015, with:
