Office Of The Public Counsel's Positions on the Issues

COMES NOW the Office of the Public Counsel and respectfully submits the its positions on the issues in this case:

- 1. What, if any action should the Commission take regarding number conservation (ie., number pooling, sequential numbering assignments, etc.) in the following NPAs?
 - 1) 314: Number conservation in 314 must come quickly and be executed with near perfection in order for number conservation to significantly postpone NPA relief. Given that premise, the PSC should concentrate its pooling efforts and other number conservation efforts in 816 since there is more likelihood those efforts will have a greater benefit than in 314.
 - 2) 816: The PSC should continue its efforts for number conservation in 816, including reviewing possible rate center consolidations. (Meisenheimer Direct, p 35) The PSC should consider requesting the ability to switch its number pooling authority from the FCC from 314/636 to 816 since the benefits for pooling is better in 816 at this time.

For both NPAs, Public Counsel believes that the PSC should be aggressive in reclaiming unneeded codes. The PSC should obtain and review data on a regular basis to fulfill its role that submissions are accurate and codes and blocks are only assigned as necessary. (Direct, p. 34)

Due to the PSC's order on Friday July 21, 2000, Public Counsel reserves additional comment on this issue based on its analysis in its response on July 27, 2000.

- 2. What area code releif should the Commission order implemented in the following NPAs:
 - 314: Number conservation should be used to extend the life of 314 as long as
 possible, but the extent that it can be extended is uncertain. Public Counsel
 realizes that number conservation is not a substitute for NPA relief but is an
 additional tool.

Public Counsel believes that the PSC should order relief through an all service overlay of the existing 314 NPA with a new area code as this is the best relief measure available under the circumstances. (Meisenheimer Direct, p.6, 30-31) When the number of assignable central office codes in 314 falls below 90, the plan should be initiated. (Meisenheimer Direct, p. 30) This indicates a rate of code usage of 10 codes per month, which is reasonable. (Meisenheimer Direct, p. 30).

Public Counsel opposes the retroactive overlay as unnecessary and bad public policy. (Meisenheimer Direct, p.28-31)

2) 816: Public Counsel recommends that the PSC postpone the final decision on the specific relief plan until the number of assignable codes falls below 100. (Meisenheimer, Direct, p. 31-32). There is a much greater chance of extending the initial life of 816 given the lower demand for codes of 7 per month and code reclamation efforts. (Meisenheimer Direct, p. 32; Rebuttal, p. 12-13; p.9)

Public Counsel is hesitant to recommend a specific relief plan since the need for relief may be 2.4 years away and number conservation methods are in their infancy. Either a geographic split along the Missouri River or an overlay may be reasonable options, but it is too early to tell at this time. The PSC should leave the question open now and revisit the issue within the year to see how conservation measures have worked and review the code usage status. (Meisenheimer Direct, p 7, 31-32)
