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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Good morning. My name is
- 3 Kevin Thompson. I'm the Regulatory Law Judge
- 4 assigned to preside over this matter, which is In
- 5 the Matter of the Application of the City of
- 6 Hannibal, Missouri, and Public Water Supply
- 7 District No. 1 of Ralls County, Missouri, for
- 8 Approval of a Territorial Agreement Concerning
- 9 Territory Encompassing part of Ralls County,
- 10 Missouri, Case No. WO-2002-17.
- 11 Let's go ahead and have oral entries of
- 12 appearance at this time. We'll start over here
- 13 with Public Counsel.
- MS. O'NEILL: Good morning. My name is
- 15 Ruth O'Neill for the Office of Public Counsel. My
- address is P.O. Box 7800, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 17 65102.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 19 Staff?
- 20 MS. KIZITO: I'm Victoria Kizito. I'm
- 21 appearing for the Staff of the Missouri Public
- 22 Service Commission. My address is the Governor
- Office Building, Suite 800, 200 Madison Street,
- 24 Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 25 65102.

- 1 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 2 Sir?
- 3 MR. RODENBAUGH: Good morning. Rodney
- 4 Rodenbaugh here for Public Water Supply District
- 5 No. 1 of Ralls County. My address is 423 South
- 6 Main Street, New London, Missouri.
- 7 JUDGE THOMPSON: Sir?
- 8 MR. BLAYLOCK: My name is Jeff Blaylock.
- 9 I'm here for the City of Hannibal, Missouri. My
- 10 address is 609 East Walnut Street, Columbia,
- 11 Missouri 65201.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 13 At this time do the parties have anything
- 14 to bring to the attention of the Commission?
- MR. BLAYLOCK: Judge?
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Mr. Blaylock?
- 17 MR. BLAYLOCK: On behalf of the City of
- 18 Hannibal, I understand we're here for the purpose
- of a prehearing conference to discuss possibility
- of settlement and also some scheduling and other
- 21 hearing particulars.
- 22 With respect to the territorial agreement
- 23 that has been presented to the Public Service
- 24 Commission for approval, as far as the parties are
- 25 concerned, that is, the Water District and the City

- of Hannibal, I do not believe there's any dispute
- 2 between us at this time as to the terms of that
- 3 agreement. However, it is our understanding that
- 4 the Water Supply District does have outstanding
- 5 Federal loans through the USDA. And as a term of
- 6 those loans, the USDA would also seek to -- well,
- 7 approve the agreement, if you will, with respect to
- 8 security for their loans.
- 9 It is my understanding that yesterday the
- 10 counsel for Water District and certain of the board
- 11 members met with USDA representatives and
- 12 attorneys, and it is my understanding that the USDA
- does have some concerns about this agreement. I'm
- 14 not sure what the particulars of those concerns are
- or what particular aspects of the agreement are
- 16 that the USDA has problems with.
- 17 For that reason, Judge, it would be my
- 18 request and suggestion -- and I have not had a
- 19 chance to speak with PSC Counsel or Public Counsel
- 20 in this regard. This just happened yesterday --
- 21 would be my request and recommendation that any
- 22 hearing that is ultimately had on the application
- for approval be set as far as back as possible
- 24 within the 120-day timeline to allow us to meet and
- confer with the USDA and each other and see if we

- 1 can resolve any problems the USDA has in that
- 2 regard.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay.
- 4 MR. RODENBAUGH: Judge, if I may further
- 5 clarify?
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Yes, Mr. Rodenbaugh?
- 7 MR. RODENBAUGH: I essentially concur with
- 8 what Mr. Blaylock has said. And to further state
- 9 to you and others here present, that I did, in
- 10 fact, meet with the USDA yesterday and there are
- 11 some potential problems they are looking at with
- 12 the agreement. They are supposed to get to us in a
- 13 timely way what those are and hopefully those can
- 14 be resolved to the satisfaction of all parties
- 15 involved here.
- 16 And I would agree with Mr. Blaylock, if we
- 17 can set this matter back far enough so that they
- 18 can inform us of what these problems are, and
- 19 hopefully we can resolve those and proceed with
- 20 this application.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Very well. Thank you.
- 22 Anybody else?
- MS. O'NEILL: I don't have anything at
- this time, Judge.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.

- 1 MS. KIZITO: I also don't have anything.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: I'm glad you mentioned
- 3 the 120-day timeline. We do have a statutory
- 4 drop-dead date in this case, so I don't know what
- 5 degree of flexibility we have or how far off we can
- 6 set things. This also, the territorial agreement,
- 7 falls into a small class of cases where it's our
- 8 interpretation of the law a hearing is required
- 9 even though the parties may be in complete
- 10 agreement and there is nothing that needs to be
- 11 determined from the evidence of witnesses.
- 12 So at some point we're going to have to
- schedule and hold a hearing even if it's simply
- 14 15 minutes, put somebody on the stand to explain,
- 15 Hey, here's the agreement. We all agree.
- 16 Good-bye. The USDA matter raises some interesting
- 17 questions. I assume that you say you have got
- 18 outstanding loans, I guess they must have a
- 19 security interest in facilities owned by the Water
- 20 Supply District. The extent to which that can
- 21 impede the State of Missouri in setting out the
- 22 territory of a political subdivision is an
- 23 interesting question.
- 24 You-all will have the room until
- 25 five o'clock. You will have ample opportunity to

- discuss all of these issues and determine how best
- 2 to proceed. And there's a procedural schedule due
- 3 a week from today. We will, of course, entertain
- 4 any sort of motion that you might see fit to file
- 5 in order to derail that or change it or set it back
- 6 or whatever it is that you think is necessary.
- 7 Okay.
- 8 Anything else?
- 9 MS. O'NEILL: Not at this time.
- 10 JUDGE THOMPSON: There being nothing
- 11 further, the recorded portion of the prehearing
- 12 conference is adjourned. Thank you-all very much
- 13 for coming down today.
- 14 WHEREUPON, the on-the-record portion of
- 15 the prehearing conference was concluded.

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
