**ORDER DIRECTING RESPONDENT TO SHOW CAUSE WHY**  
**AN ORDER GRANTING DEFAULT SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED**

The Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a complaint against Winstar Communications, LLC, on June 29, 2007, which resulted in the Missouri Public Service Commission opening this case.

On July 10, 2007, the Commission issued a Notice of Complaint in this case. The notice was sent via certified mail and received by both the respondent and its registered agent on July 12, 2007.

Among other things, the Notice of Complaint provided Winstar with a copy of the complaint and informed Winstar it had thirty days from the date of the notice to file its answer. More than thirty days have passed since the Commission issued its Notice of Complaint, and Winstar has not filed an answer.

Under Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.070(9), "[i]f the respondent in a complaint case fails to file a timely answer, the complainant's averments may be deemed admitted

and an order granting default entered.” Winstar will be ordered to file a pleading stating good cause for its failure to timely file its answer to Staff’s complaint. Winstar is advised that if it fails to provide a good reason for not timely filing its answer, the Commission could find Winstar has admitted the averments contained in Staff’s complaint and issue of an order granting default in favor of the complainant.

**IT IS ORDERED THAT:**

1. Winstar Communications, LLC, shall file a statement, not later than August 24, 2007, showing cause why the Commission should not issue an order granting default in favor of the complainant.
2. This order shall become effective on August 16, 2007.
