NOTICE ACKNOWLEDGING VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL OF COMPLAINT
AND CLOSING CASE

Issue Date: June 25, 2008

Mary Robinson filed a formal complaint against Respondent Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. d/b/a AT&T Missouri ("AT&T") on May 12, 2008. By order dated June 11, 2008, the parties were directed to mediate their dispute. On June 25, 2008, prior to the filing of any prepared testimony or the submission of any oral evidence, Ms. Robinson filed her Dismissal Memo, in which she stated that she was dismissing her complaint against AT&T with prejudice.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) permits a complainant to voluntarily dismiss her complaint without an order of the Commission "at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties." No prepared testimony or oral evidence has been offered in this case, and the Dismissal Memo has been filed with the Commission and served on all parties. Therefore, the Commission acknowledges that Ms. Robinson has

voluntarily dismissed her complaint against AT&T with prejudice pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.116(1).¹ Nothing remains for decision by the Commission and this case may be closed.
