ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT

On January 7, 2013, T. Mark Nixon filed a complaint against AT&T on behalf of Nixon and Company, Inc. Nixon and Company, Inc. is a corporation and must be represented by an attorney. On January 17, the Commission issued a notice questioning Complainant's status as an attorney while informing him that an attorney must represent any corporation filing a complaint before the Commission. The Commission also informed Complainant that if this deficiency was not cured within 90 days, the Commission may dismiss this complaint.


Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.116 (2) states that the Commission may dismiss a case if there has been no action in that case for 90 days. More than 90 days have expired and there has been no action on this complaint. The Commission will therefore dismiss this complaint. However, because the Commission has not considered the substance of the complaint, Complainant may refile this complaint after securing an attorney. If Complainant

chooses to refile the complaint, the Commission will assign a new file number to the complaint and proceed accordingly.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. This complaint is dismissed.
2. This order shall become effective on June 14, 2013.
3. This case shall be closed on June 15, 2013.
