PROCEEDINGS 1 2 JUDGE JONES: This is a prehearing 3 conference for Case No. TC-2006-0068, FullTel, 4 Incorporated vs. CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC. My name is 5 Kennard Jones. I'm presiding judge over this matter. 6 At this time we'll take entries of 7 appearance, beginning with Mr. Comley. 8 MR. COMLEY: Thank you, Judge. Let the 9 record reflect the entry of appearance of -- let the record reflect the entry of appearance of Mark W. Comley, 10 Newman, Comley & Ruth, 601 Monroe, Suite 301, 11 Jefferson City, Missouri 65101, on behalf of the 12 13 complainant FullTel, Inc. 14 JUDGE JONES: Mr. Dority? 15 MR. DORITY: Thank you, your Honor. Appearing on behalf of Respondent CenturyTel of Missouri, 16 17 LLC, Larry W. Dority, Fischer & Dority, PC. Our address is 101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101. 18 19 JUDGE JONES: And for the Staff of the 20 Commission? 21 MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for the Staff, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101. 22 23 JUDGE JONES: Are there any attorneys that 24 have joined us on the phone? MR. DORITY: Mr. Cline or Mr. Shimshaw, 25

1 have you joined us? 2 MR. SHIMSHAW: Yes, your Honor. This is 3 Cal Shimshaw. I'm in-house counsel with CenturyTel. 4 JUDGE JONES: Would you like to enter your 5 appearance? 6 MR. DORITY: We have not formally entered 7 his appearance at this point, your Honor. I think he is 8 going to join us primarily for the discussions that we 9 hope that will take place off the record. 10 JUDGE JONES: That will be fine. 11 MR. COMLEY: And that is similar with 12 Mr. Cline. At this stage we have not formally moved for 13 his appearance pro hoc vice in this proceeding, but he may be calling in to participate later. 14 JUDGE JONES: Okay. Well, first let's deal 15 with CenturyTel's request for voluntary mediation. How 16 does FullTel feel about that? 17 MR. COMLEY: Judge, and I think we should 18 19 have probably highlighted it a little bit more, but in a 20 footnote to our recent response to CenturyTel's pleading, 21 we did note that at this stage, no, we would not consent 22 to voluntary mediation, and on the record we'll not 23 consent to voluntary mediation. JUDGE JONES: And I'll issue a motion 24 regarding your motion to dismiss early next week. 25

One thing I wanted to bring up, and this is 1 2 just from my cursory review of your interconnection 3 agreement, in Section 14 there's a section called dispute 4 resolution. Have you-all looked at that and abided by its 5 terms? Here, you can have my copy to look at. 6 MR. COMLEY: My response to the Court's 7 request would be that, yes, I think that the parties have 8 examined paragraph 14 of the agreement and, so far as I understand it, have resolved in -- have resolved the 9 questions of dispute resolution raised in that paragraph 10 11 in favor of the complaint that's before the Commission. 12 Mr. Dority may have another idea about that. 13 MR. DORITY: I'm not sure I understand, Mark, what you just said. 14 15 MR. COMLEY: I'm thinking that so far 16 there's been no objection raised to the complaint filed in this Commission based upon provisions of paragraph 14. 17 18 MR. DORITY: That is correct, your Honor. 19 We have not raised the dispute resolution clause contained 20 in paragraph 14.1 at this stage. We have not. JUDGE JONES: Seems like you'd have to do 21 22 that before we were even involved, before the Commission has anything to say. It seems like you have to look to 23 24 how the agreement deals with disputes. That's just something for you-all to consider. What I'm thinking is 25

September 28th I believe is a date that I was looking at 1 2 for a hearing. 3 MR. DORITY: Yes, your Honor. 4 JUDGE JONES: Are you all amenable to that 5 date? Is that a good date for you all? 6 MR. COMLEY: Yes. We're ready to go. 7 MR. DORITY: Judge --8 JUDGE JONES: And I ask that just so I can 9 put it on the calendar. 10 MR. DORITY: As you know, your Honor, we have voiced our objections to the expedited treatment 11 that's been afforded this matter, and I do want to take a 12 13 moment and thank your Honor for the additional time you 14 did give us for responding in your Order that was issued 15 on August 23rd. 16 We, of course, have filed our request for 17 voluntary mediation, which the Complainant has denied both in their earlier pleading and then this morning Mr. Comley 18 19 reiterated that on the record. Of course, we filed our 20 motion to dismiss answering affirmative defenses on 21 August 31st. 22 We would anticipate that to the extent 23 possible if we can go off the record this morning and 24 engage in some discussions with Mr. Comley and to the extent that Mr. Cline may be able to join us, we are 25

hopeful that those discussions will be fruitful and we 1 would be able to dispense with having to go to a formal 2 3 evidentiary hearing that you've now set on the 28th. 4 I guess, Judge, in your earlier Order you 5 had also indicated that all of the hearing itself would be 6 conducted with live testimony, no prefiled. 7 JUDGE JONES: That's correct. 8 MR. DORITY: And I think you're 9 anticipating that we would be filing prehearing briefs as well. And I know that you have not at this point 10 scheduled a due date for those. The Respondent was going 11 12 to request, Judge, that we be given until perhaps one day 13 midweek next week -- I have my calendar here -- I think 14 Wednesday, the 21st. 15 We would suggest that the parties be 16 allowed to report back to your Honor the status at that 17 point, and to the extent that we're not able to reach a 18 resolution, then perhaps we can be looking at prehearing briefs either that Friday or the Monday of the following 19 20 week looking at a hearing on that Wednesday the 28th. 21 That's a long response to your question of 22 is the 28th a good date. Yes, to the extent --23 JUDGE JONES: It's necessary. 24 MR. DORITY: -- that it's necessary, as far 25 as I know, we would be able to have our witnesses here and

1 be prepared to participate.

2 JUDGE JONES: Mr. Comley, is that good for you, Staff report next Wednesday, briefs on the 23rd and 3 4 then a hearing on the 28th? 5 MR. COMLEY: Yes, that's perfectly fine. 6 JUDGE JONES: As far as the briefs are 7 concerned, I mean, and this is not a slight on attorneys, 8 but attorneys tend to be long-winded. I've got a feeling 9 this disagreement can be very specific. I think this is a 10 contract dispute. There's a clause in the contract that you-all are having a dispute about. So clearly point that 11 out, and any law or statutory rules and case law that 12 13 supports your position. 14 Does Staff have anything to add to the 15 schedule that we're discussing? 16 MR. POSTON: No. 17 JUDGE JONES: All right. What kind of witnesses do you expect to call, if necessary? 18 MR. COMLEY: I think we've probably 19 identified only two, and I think the documents won't be --20 21 they won't be too much of a burden. Our exhibit list may 22 not be like some of the monuments that we've seen in other 23 cases. 24 JUDGE JONES: Mr. Dority? 25 MR. DORITY: I think we would anticipate

two witnesses as well, your Honor. 1 2 JUDGE JONES: So this is something we can 3 do in one day? 4 MR. DORITY: I believe we could. I do. 5 MR. POSTON: We're going to have two 6 witnesses as well. 7 MR. COMLEY: We may be looking at a day and 8 a half, two days maybe. 9 JUDGE JONES: The 28th is a Wednesday. We'll try to get started early, then. 10 MR. DORITY: I would note that we're 11 12 involved in a prehearing conference on the afternoon of 13 the 29th. 14 JUDGE JONES: Is there anything else I can 15 do for you-all this morning? 16 MR. DORITY: I guess, Judge, to the extent that through our discussions we may not -- if we're not 17 18 able to ultimately resolve the whole proceeding, but to the extent that we could at least agree on the underlying 19 20 facts, that might shorten the time required for the 21 hearing, and I would hope that you might be willing to 22 entertain a stipulated facts and --23 MR. COMLEY: Certainly. 24 MR. DORITY: That might move things along. 25 JUDGE JONES: Can you-all file that on the

1 21st?

2 MR. DORITY: That might be a little tough, your Honor. I have a feeling most of our time is going to 3 4 be directed to trying to get all of the folks that are 5 necessary on the telephone and move through the issues. 6 Could that be part and parcel of what would be filed on the 23rd? 7 8 JUDGE JONES: That's fine. Does Staff 9 have anything to add? 10 MR. POSTON: No, we don't. JUDGE JONES: Okay. Anything else from 11 12 you-all? I've got --MR. DORITY: I don't believe so, your 13 14 Honor. JUDGE JONES: Are you waiting on someone 15 16 else to join you? 17 MR. DORITY: Yeah. I think we're hoping 18 that Mr. Cline will be able to join us. Maybe Mark can check with him off line and see what his status is. 19 20 JUDGE JONES: Okay. With that, then, we'll 21 go off the record and I'll leave you-all to try to work this out. 22 23 WHEREUPON, the recorded portion of the 24 prehearing conference was concluded. 25
