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1 PROCEEDINGS
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- 2 RLJ DIPPELL: This is Case No. TO-2005-0141
- 3 in the matter of the request for expansion of the
- 4 St. Louis Metropolitan Calling Area Plan to include the
- 5 exchanges of Washington, Union, Write City, St. Clair,
- 6 Marthasville, Beaufort, Foley and Warrenton.
- 7 We've come here today for a status
- 8 conference to see where this case stands and where we're
- 9 going to go from here.
- 10 And I have Ms. McDonald for AT&T Missouri on
- 11 the phone. And I'm going to allow the attorneys to make
- 12 entries of appearance at this time.
- 13 Let's start with Staff.
- MR. POSTON: I'm Marc Poston for the Staff
- of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- 16 MR. DANDINO: Michael Dandino, Office of the
- 17 Public Counsel, Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson City,
- 18 Missouri 65102, representing the Office of Public Counsel
- 19 and the public.
- 20 MR. JOHNSON: Craig Johnson, 1648-A East
- 21 Elm, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101 for the Missouri
- 22 Independent Telephone Group and specifically Mokan and
- 23 Choctow.
- 24 MR. DORITY: Larry Dority with Fischer &
- Dority, P.C., appearing on behalf of CenturyTel of

- 1 Missouri LLC and Spectra Communications Group LLC, doing
- 2 business as CenturyTel. My address is 101 Madison,
- 3 Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101.
- 4 RLJ DIPPELL: And Ms. McDonald.
- 5 MS. MCDONALD: Mimi McDonald for
- 6 Southwestern Bell Telephone LP, doing business as AT&T
- 7 Missouri. Our address is 1 SBC Center, Room 3510,
- 8 St. Louis, Missouri 63101.
- 9 MR. MCCARTNEY: Brian T. McCartney of the
- 10 law firm Brydon, Swearengen and England PC. My address
- 11 is 312 East Capitol Avenue, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 12 65102, appearing today on behalf of Fidelity Telephone
- 13 Company and Orchard Farm Telephone Company.
- 14 RLJ DIPPELL: I apologize, Mr. McCartney. I
- 15 looked right at you and then I just skipped you.
- I'm operating on a little bit less sleep
- 17 than I should have. I apologize. A sick child at home.
- 18 Anyway, the reason I wanted to call the
- 19 status conference is because right now we have an
- 20 agreement with AT&T Missouri, Staff and Office of Public
- 21 Counsel pending, and then CenturyTel had sort of promised
- 22 us an agreement but that didn't materialize.
- 23 Mr. Dority, what's the status of that?
- MR. DORITY: Well, thank you, Judge, for
- 25 setting the status conference. I think this will be

- 1 helpful.
- 2 To give you an update, we are still
- 3 discussing with Mr. Dandino and the Staff a resolution
- 4 for the exchanges that involve CenturyTel of
- 5 Missouri LLC.
- 6 As you'll recall at the public hearing in
- 7 Innsbrook, we discussed an optional calling plan that we
- 8 have available on a promotional basis, and we are now
- 9 rolling that out and actively marketing that plan to the
- 10 customers in that particular area. And I have every
- 11 reason to believe that it is being met with a positive
- 12 response.
- 13 I think the testimony that was elicited at
- 14 the public hearing indicated that the customers would be
- 15 very interested in that sort of approach as opposed to
- 16 the MCA plan.
- 17 If you'll recall, I believe we only had a
- 18 total of four residential customers that actually
- 19 testified at Innsbrook.
- 20 And my quick review of the transcript that
- 21 was just made available, it confirmed my remembrance that
- 22 the customers were more concerned with an outbound
- 23 calling plan. They were not interested in changing their
- 24 phone numbers.
- 25 And I have every reason to believe that the

- 1 optional calling plan that we're now marketing will be
- 2 very well received and I think will address the concerns
- 3 that were indicated.
- I don't want to speak for Mr. Dandino, but,
- 5 you know, we're thinking that particularly for the
- 6 residential customer class, that this may indeed address
- 7 the issues.
- 8 As far as the business class of customers,
- 9 you know, I guess I would remind the judge that there was
- 10 really only one business customer that testified at the
- 11 hearing in Innsbrook and that only involved one of the
- 12 exchanges and that was Warrenton, Missouri.
- We are still looking at what options might
- 14 be available to address the business community needs to
- 15 the extent that there are any that are not being met
- 16 today.
- We're hopeful that within a very short
- 18 amount of time that we can perhaps come to a proposed
- 19 resolution for the business customer class.
- 20 Simply put, we're still trying to come up
- 21 with a final proposal that we can present to the
- 22 Commission. We would hope to be able to reach a
- 23 resolution with both the Office of Public Counsel and
- 24 Staff regarding that.
- 25 From a timeline standpoint, I don't know,

- 1 maybe ten days to two weeks. I know that this has gone
- 2 on much longer than the Commission would probably wish
- 3 for it to at this point.
- 4 All I can say is we have been diligent, and
- 5 we're trying to make sure that we come up with a solution
- 6 that will truly serve the needs of our customer base.
- 7 And so I guess at this point, you know, I
- 8 think we're very close in terms of the residential class.
- 9 And in terms of the business, we hope to have something
- 10 that we can present to the Commission within a week or
- 11 two.
- 12 RLJ DIPPELL: Mr. Dandino, is the Office of
- 13 Public Counsel wanting to move forward with, say, a
- 14 stipulation hearing, if the Commissioners wish, on the
- 15 SBC --
- MR. DANDINO: Oh, certainly.
- 17 RLJ DIPPELL: -- agreement?
- 18 MR. DANDINO: In fact, we were going to
- 19 request -- and I talked with Ms. McDonald for AT&T. And
- 20 we both see that -- you know, we kind of see these as
- 21 separate, at least for resolution of it.
- 22 And we think there is no problem about
- 23 proceeding on with the stipulation and agreement. And I
- 24 know AT&T says they're willing to stand by that and so
- 25 are we. Because I think it addresses probably a

- 1 different -- maybe the same problem but in a different
- 2 way. Each company has their own costs and everything
- 3 else. So I think that can go separately.
- 4 As far as what Mr. Dority has said, I agree
- 5 that the Office of Public Counsel, we reviewed the
- 6 offering that they're making for the customers there and
- 7 it's in kind of a trial mode right now.
- 8 But, you know, based on the testimony of the
- 9 people there, what they wanted, plus the price and the
- 10 value received, and -- by the customers, it looks like
- 11 that will address, you know, the calling needs in that
- 12 community, at least in the Innsbrook, Wright City and
- 13 Warrenton, that area, those exchanges.
- 14 The biggest problem, and the one that has to
- 15 be dealt with is, of course, the business side. Because
- 16 we kind of looked at the testimony in -- at the
- 17 Washington hearing kind of as related to it, and the fact
- 18 that they need more two-way calling and the economies
- 19 need two-way calling for businesses with the metropolitan
- 20 area more than just the outbound that the residential
- 21 people prefer.
- 22 So that is kind of where we are. And
- 23 CenturyTel has been very cooperative. And in discussing
- 24 with us -- we've met them a number of times. I feel like
- 25 I'm -- Larry Dority and I are getting to know each other

- 1 very well.
- 2 And AT&T, Ms. McDonald, they were very
- 3 cooperative and are working with us to enter into the
- 4 stipulation and agreement, as well as Staff.
- 5 RLJ DIPPELL: Okay. The reason, I guess, I
- 6 was concerned about moving forward with the SBC or the
- 7 AT&T agreement just was because there was some testimony
- 8 at the local public hearings about -- at least the people
- 9 in the Marthasville exchange concerned about one going
- 10 forward without the other, and I didn't know if that had
- 11 changed your opinion about that, Mr. Dandino.
- MR. DANDINO: Mr. Kramme from the
- 13 Marthasville also attended both hearings.
- 14 And I think -- I think it is -- it is -- at
- 15 least if the people in Washington or in the SBC or AT&T
- 16 exchanges have the MCA, they'll at least be able to call
- 17 into the Marthasville and then Marthasville will be able
- 18 to call them, I guess. Well, maybe not.
- 19 I think -- I don't think we ought to hold up
- 20 the other ones, because, I think it's especially
- 21 significant for the business side, as the testimony was
- 22 at the hearing, for, you know, especially the St. Clair
- 23 area with their industrial park and Washington and Union
- 24 area.
- 25 MR. DORITY: And, Judge, just to be clear, I

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1 apologize. I did not address that aspect of it.
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- 2 But certainly CenturyTel would have no
- 3 objection to the Commission moving forward and addressing
- 4 the stipulation and agreement and would support that.
- 5 RLJ DIPPELL: Okay. Then I guess what I'd
- 6 like to find out from the attorneys is maybe a date that
- 7 we could look at having a stip hearing, if that's what
- 8 the Commissioners want to do, where they could ask
- 9 questions, and I'd like to set that as soon as I could.
- 10 Looking at the Commission's calendar, it
- 11 looks like February 21st, 22nd, 27th or 28th would all be
- 12 available.
- Would any of those dates be available with
- 14 you, Ms. McDonald?
- 15 Are you there and just looking?
- MR. DORITY: Hello, Mimi.
- 17 RLJ DIPPELL: Okay. Ms. McDonald, are you
- 18 there?
- MS. MCDONALD: I'm here.
- 20 RLJ DIPPELL: Did you hear the conversation?
- 21 MS. MCDONALD: I could hear that you were
- 22 saying -- I understood that you were saying dates, the
- 23 21st, the 27th, the 28th. Is that a date to present the
- 24 stipulation and agreement to the Commission?
- 25 RLJ DIPPELL: Yes.

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1 MS. MCDONALD: To my knowledge, I think all
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- 2 of those dates would be good.
- 3 RLJ DIPPELL: Would they be available with
- 4 the other parties?
- 5 MR. POSTON: That's fine with us.
- 6 MR. DANDINO: I believe so.
- 7 MR. DORITY: I believe so.
- 8 RLJ DIPPELL: Then I will pick one of those
- 9 dates and set probably a stipulation hearing and you
- 10 should see an order coming out on that today or tomorrow.
- 11 All right. Would there be anything else
- 12 that anyone would like to discuss on the record?
- 13 MR. DORITY: Just, Judge, thanks for setting
- 14 this conference, and to the extent that we're able to
- 15 reach a resolution prior to the date, then -- I'm
- 16 anticipating that the Commissioners are going to be
- 17 asking me what the status is regarding the CenturyTel
- 18 exchanges at the stipulation presentation, and we'll be
- 19 prepared to address that.
- 20 RLJ DIPPELL: All right.
- 21 And then I'll probably also set a time for a
- 22 formal status report on that side also.
- Is there anything else?
- 24 All right. Then seeing nothing further, we
- 25 can go off the record.
