ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR EXPEDITED DECISION

Issue Date: July 12, 2006 Effective Date: July 12, 2006

On June 30, 2006, T-Mobile USA, Inc., filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission against Green Hills Telecommunications Services and Mark Twain Communications Company. The complaint alleged that the respondent companies notified T-Mobile that they had requested that AT&T Missouri block T-Mobile traffic destined to the specified exchanges served by the Respondents. T-Mobile asked the Commission to find that the Respondents' attempts to block its traffic are prohibited under federal law.

The complaint alleges that the Respondents threatened to block T-Mobile's traffic beginning on and after July 21, 2006. Because of the threat to block its traffic, T-Mobile requested that the Commission rule, on or before July 21, that the Respondents and AT&T Missouri are prohibited from blocking T-Mobile's traffic until a hearing can be held on T-Mobile's complaint.

In response to a Commission order, the Respondents filed a pleading on July 7, indicating that they have ceased preparations for blocking T-Mobile's traffic until after the Commission has issued its decision on T-Mobile's complaint. The Respondents agree, however, that the Commission should resolve T-Mobile's complaint as quickly as possible.

The Commission will certainly attempt to resolve T-Mobile's complaint as quickly as possible. However, the Respondents' decision not to block T-Mobile's traffic on July 21 removes the need for an immediate Commission decision on that aspect of the case. Therefore, the expedited decision sought in T-Mobile's Motion for Expedited Treatment is no longer needed and for that reason, the motion will be denied.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. T-Mobile USA, Inc.'s Motion for Expedited Treatment is denied.
- 2. This order shall become effective on July 12, 2006.
