ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO POSTPONE PREHEARING CONFERENCE

On January 29, 2008, the Commission entered an order setting this matter for a prehearing conference on February 7, 2008. On February 1, 2008, Staff filed its "Motion to Join AT&T Missouri as a Party," which is still pending at this time. On February 4, 2008, Respondent McLeodUSA Telecommunications Services, Inc. ("McLeod") filed a motion requesting that the prehearing conference be postponed "until sometime after the Commission rules on Staff's Motion to Join AT&T Missouri as a Party," contending that it would be "inefficient to proceed with the Prehearing conference while Staff's motion is pending, in light of the uncertainty as to whether all necessary parties have been identified, joined, and been given adequate notice of the prehearing conference."

The Commission finds McLeod's request, which is authorized by Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.050(3)(A) and has not been opposed by Staff, OPC, or Complainant Duke Manufacturing Co., to be reasonable under the circumstances and shall grant it.¹

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. McLeodUSA Telecommunications Services, Inc.'s motion to postpone the prehearing conference originally scheduled for February 7, 2008 is granted.
- 2. No longer than one week after the Commission issues its ruling on Staff's pending Motion to Join AT&T Missouri as a Party, the parties shall meet and confer and jointly file an appropriate pleading containing a proposed date and time for the prehearing conference.
 - 3. This order shall become effective on February 6, 2008.
