ORDER GRANTING DESIGNATION AS AN ELIGIBLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIER

Issue Date: June 2, 2021 Effective Date: June 12, 2021

On April 16, 2021, Windstream Communications, LLC (Windstream) filed its application for designation as a wireless Eligible Telecommunications Carrier.¹ Windstream was recently awarded federal Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) support to build broadband facilities in more rural areas.

The Commission issued notice and set a deadline for intervention. No intervention requests were received.

The Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) conducted an investigation and on May 24, 2021, filed its recommendation and memorandum. Staff recommended that the Commission approve Windstream's request for designation as an eligible telecommunications carriers for the purpose of receiving federal high-cost and low-income support for census blocks identified in Exhibit A of the application. Staff stated Windstream met the requirements of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-31.016 governing

eligible telecommunications carriers. Staff notes that Windstream requests a waiver of the 60-day notice requirement of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-4.017, and recommends that such waiver be granted.

Under federal authority, the application is within the Commission's jurisdiction to decide.² Since no law requires a hearing, this is a non-contested case.³ Non-contested cases do not require formal proceedings or hearings before the Commission, and as such, there is no evidentiary record.⁴ Consequently, the Commission bases its decision on the verified filings.

Based upon its review of the verified application and Staff's recommendation and memorandum, the Commission finds that Windstream has met the requirements for ETC designation. Further, for good cause shown, Windstream will be granted a waiver of the 60-day filing requirement of the Commission's rules.

Because Windstream needs this order to be effective as soon as possible to comply with FCC requirements, the Commission will make this order effective in less than thirty days.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Windstream's application is granted. Windstream is granted ETC status for the purpose of receiving federal high-cost and low-income support in the area identified by census block groups described in Exhibit A to its application.
- 2. Windstream is granted a waiver of the 60-day notice requirement of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-4.017.
