- 1. On October 14, 2009, CIMCO Communications, Inc. and Comcast Phone of Missouri, LLC d/b/a Comcast Digital Phone (referred to herein as CIMCO and Comcast, respectively) filed an application for approval of the transfer of the Missouri customer base of CIMCO to Comcast.
- 2. On November 5, the Staff of the Commission filed its recommendation, concluding that "the Commission [should] grant the Applicants' request to transfer the CIMCO customers to Comcast pursuant to the tariff revisions wherein CIMCO has withdrawn its existing tariff and adopted the Comcast tariff in its entirety."
- 3. Public Counsel does not object to the Commission's approval of the transfer, based upon the Staff review and recommendation and, in particular, the representations Comcast as to how the transferred customers will be treated. See attached Exhibit 1, which consists of an email from Comcast counsel to Barb Meisenheimer of the Office of the Public Counsel.

It was a pleasure speaking with you earlier. I really do appreciate your conscientious review of this transaction. As we discussed:

- 1. Comcast will not impose a "change charge" on customers that are switched from Cimco to Comcast; and
- 2. In the event that a customer chooses not to stay with Comcast after the transaction closes, Comcast will only impose an early termination charge if the current Cimco-customer contract authorizes Comcast to do so. Such contracts will have to be assignable and contain an early termination payment requirements clause.
