1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(Written Entries of Appearance filed.)
3	JUDGE RUTH: Let's go on the record, please
4	Good morning. My name is Vicki Ruth, and I
5	will be the Regulatory Law Judge that conducts the
6	hearing. As you know, this case is assigned to Deput
7	Chief Law Judge Kevin Thompson. It is still assigned
8	to him. I will simply be conducting the hearing this
9	week and next week.
LO	Today's date is May 29, 2001; it is 8:35,
L1	and we are here for a hearing in ER-2001-299 in the
L2	matter of The Empire District Electric Company's
L3	tariff sheets designed to implement a general rate
L4	increase for retail electric service provided to
L5	customers in the Missouri service area of the Company
L6	According to the procedural schedule
L7	proposed by the parties and adopted by the Commission
L8	today's hearing will consist simply of the entries of
L9	appearance and marking the exhibits. Tomorrow,
20	Wednesday, May 30th, we will begin at 8:30 with the
21	opening statements. This hearing is scheduled to end
22	on Friday, June 8th.
23	Before we do the entries of appearance, I
24	would like to point out that I would like the parties

to take a look at the proposed schedule and give me an

25

- idea at the end of today if you will be able to move
- 2 on at the end of one day if we finish with an issue
- 3 and witnesses, if you will be able to move on to the
- 4 next day. We need to take a look at that. I don't
- 5 want to, by chance, finish with the last scheduled
- 6 witness for the day at 3:00 and not be able to move
- 7 on. So take a look at that before we leave.
- 8 We'll move on to entries of appearance, and
- 9 Empire, we'll begin with you.
- 10 MR. DUFFY: Let the record reflect the entry
- of appearance of Gary W. Duffy, James C. Swearengen,
- 12 and Dean L. Cooper, law firm of Brydon, Swearengen &
- 13 England, P.C., P.O. Box 456, Jefferson City, Missouri,
- 14 65102.
- JUDGE RUTH: Thank you.
- 16 And Staff?
- 17 MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. Steven Dottheim,
- 18 Dennis L. Fray, Dana K. Joyce, Nathan Williams, Eric
- 19 Anderson, David Meyer, and Bruce Bates, appearing on
- 20 behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 21 Commission, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City,
- 22 Missouri, 65102.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay. Public Counsel?
- MR. COFFMAN: Thank you.
- John B. Coffman, appearing on behalf of the

- 1 Office of the Public Counsel and the ratepaying
- 2 public, P.O. Box 7800, Jefferson City, Missouri,
- 3 65102.
- 4 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you.
- 5 And Praxair.
- 6 MR. CONRAD: Your Honor, I'm Stuart W.
- 7 Conrad of the law firm Finnegan, Conrad & Peterson,
- 8 Suite 1209, 3100 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri.
- 9 It's my expectation to handle most of this
- 10 case, but I might also be spelled on a day or two by
- 11 Jeremiah D. Finnegan, also of the same law firm and
- 12 address.
- JUDGE RUTH: Thank you very much.
- 14 Do the parties have any preliminary matters
- 15 that we need to address before we move on to marking
- 16 the exhibits?
- 17 Mr. Dottheim.
- 18 MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes, Judge Ruth. I just
- 19 might note for purposes of the record that pursuant to
- 20 the Commission's order of May 24, 2001, the Commission
- 21 order directing filing, this morning before 8:30 the
- 22 Staff filed an Addendum to List of Issues, List of
- 23 Witnesses, and Order of Cross-examination, and the
- 24 Staff also filed prior to 8:30 this morning an
- 25 Addendum of the Staff's Statement of Position on the

- 1 issues.
- JUDGE RUTH: Thank you.
- 3 That is noted for the record. And I'll also
- 4 comment that before 8:30, Public Counsel filed a
- 5 supplemental Position Statement of the Office of
- 6 Public Counsel regarding the fuel and purchase power
- 7 issue. And Public Counsel also filed a request for
- 8 leave to late file the Direct Testimony of Russell
- 9 Trippensee.
- 10 And I will grant that motion to late file
- 11 the testimony on the record. If the parties have any
- 12 objections to that, we can address your objections
- 13 when the witness is called.
- MR. COFFMAN: Thank you.
- JUDGE RUTH: Were there any other late
- 16 filings?
- MR. DUFFY: Your Honor, we filed, on behalf
- 18 of Empire, a statement -- Supplemental Statement of
- 19 Position also in compliance with the order before 8:30
- 20 this morning.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay. I didn't see a copy of
- 22 that up here. Did you bring one for me?
- MR. DUFFY: No. I think it would have just
- 24 been filed in the records office.
- JUDGE RUTH: That's fine. I'll make sure I

- 1 get my copy when we break.
- 2 MR. CONRAD: And Praxair also did the same,
- 3 but we relied on the assistance of the Commission to
- 4 bring it to your attention.
- 5 JUDGE RUTH: I will get a copy. I just did
- 6 not have one before I came down at twenty after.
- 7 MR. DOTTHEIM: Judge Ruth?
- JUDGE RUTH: Yes.
- 9 MR. DOTTHEIM: I would also note, and a copy
- 10 possibly has not caught up with you, the Staff on
- 11 Friday filed a Staff Motion for Leave for
- 12 Non-unanimous Stipulation and Agreement regarding fuel
- 13 and purchase power expense to be received for filing
- 14 and a joint recommendation and for leave for Staff
- 15 testimony to be received for filing as Staff's
- 16 testimony in support of joint recommendation.
- 17 MR. CONRAD: And, your Honor, we will have a
- 18 response to that later on today, so I'm presuming
- 19 that's going to be taken up.
- 20 Frankly, it's my understanding that there is
- 21 ten days when a motion is filed for other parties to
- 22 respond unless a shortened testimony is requested.
- 23 There was none. And we will have a response on file
- 24 this afternoon for you.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay. Thank you.

- 1 I would like for you to try and have that in
- 2 this afternoon or tomorrow morning at the latest so we
- 3 can address that on the record first thing in the
- 4 morning. Thank you.
- We will now start marking exhibits.
- 6 Did the parties intend to offer those in the
- 7 order in which they anticipate the witnesses, or was
- 8 there an alternative order?
- 9 MR. DUFFY: I think we were just going to
- 10 mark them in no particular order, but just all of
- 11 Empire's and then all of Staff's and all of Public
- 12 Counsel's and all of Praxair's that have been
- 13 pre-filed.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay. That's fine.
- We will start with Empire then.
- MR. DUFFY: I have three copies of the
- 17 Minimum Filing Requirements that were filed on
- 18 November 3rd, 2000.
- 19 As Exhibit 2, I have three copies of tariffs
- 20 that were filed on that same date.
- 21 As Exhibit 3, I have three copies of the
- 22 Direct Testimony of Myron McKinney.
- JUDGE RUTH: Mr. Conrad.
- MR. CONRAD: Nothing with an objection, but
- 25 I'm just wondering if all of this needs to be on the

- 1 record so that her hands can be --
- JUDGE RUTH: It was suggested --
- 3 MR. CONRAD: -- freed up. And at the end we
- 4 could just go through a list of what has been -- what
- 5 has been marked.
- 6 JUDGE RUTH: It was suggested I either leave
- 7 it on the record or you-all promise not to engage in
- 8 any substantive issues in between offering exhibits.
- 9 If you-all can promise that --
- 10 MR. DUFFY: Whatever you want to do is fine.
- 11 MR. CONRAD: I promise.
- 12 JUDGE RUTH: -- we can go off the record.
- 13 I'm sure none of you would ever do that, but just in
- 14 case.
- We can go off the record then.
- 16 (A DISCUSSION WAS HELD OFF THE RECORD;
- 17 EXHIBIT NOS. 1 THROUGH 97 WERE MARKED FOR
- 18 IDENTIFICATION.)
- 19 JUDGE RUTH: We'll go back on the record.
- I would just like to note that we have
- 21 marked for identification purposes Exhibits 1 through
- 22 97.
- 23 And earlier in the morning I had asked the
- 24 parties to look at the calendar we had set for this
- 25 hearing and give me an idea if by chance we finish any

- of the scheduled witnesses early if we would be able
- 2 to move on to the next day's witnesses.
- 3 MR. DUFFY: Your Honor, I'll take a stab at
- 4 that.
- 5 The parties cooperated among themselves
- 6 because several of us have outside witnesses coming in
- 7 due to travel arrangements. For example, I've got one
- 8 coming from Washington, DC and some from Kansas City,
- 9 some from Nevada.
- 10 It would be my impression -- and we
- 11 developed this schedule with the idea that the parties
- 12 who had to travel -- the witnesses who had to travel
- 13 would have some certainty as to when they would be
- 14 going on the stand so they could make their travel
- 15 arrangements.
- 16 We'll certainly try to do it on a -- on an
- 17 ad hoc basis, but my guess is that there will not be a
- 18 large shifting of issues from one day to the next.
- 19 For example, the issue scheduled for the day after
- 20 tomorrow on Thursday, to my understanding those are
- 21 all company witnesses for -- at least for the Company.
- 22 And so if we finish depreciation early, it might be
- 23 possible to do them, but I doubt if we could then move
- 24 into capital structure, because our witness on that is
- 25 from out of town and he is from Kansas.

- 1 JUDGE RUTH: So, like, on Friday the witness
- 2 for capital structure wouldn't be here until Friday.
- 3 MR. DUFFY: That's right. And along those
- 4 same lines, the witness that we've got scheduled for
- 5 the issues on Monday, most of them are from out of
- 6 town, and we've -- we've taken that into account for
- 7 their travel arrangements.
- 8 I understand we scheduled the cost of
- 9 service and rate design on Tuesday to deal with the
- 10 availability of Mr. Brubaker, Praxair's witness, so
- 11 that would be difficult to move. And we've got some
- 12 out-of-town people. Mr. Kaplan is the one I
- 13 mentioned. I think he's coming in from Washington,
- 14 DC, and he's scheduled to be here -- we'll put him on
- 15 first thing on Wednesday on the fuel purchase power
- 16 and then run through that issue completely.
- 17 So I don't think there's -- sitting here
- 18 right now, I don't think there's going to be a lot of
- 19 movement in the schedule.
- JUDGE RUTH: Staff, did you have a comment?
- 21 MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. I would concur with
- 22 that. And even on individuals who aren't traveling
- 23 great distances, I couldn't indicate about the ability
- 24 to move one issue that's already been set for one day
- 25 to an earlier date without checking with the people.

- 1 But, in particular, I think that it would probably be
- 2 desired no to be done.
- 3 The other parties might address this. It is
- 4 my impression that the schedule is believed to be so
- 5 structured such that issues can be handled in the day
- 6 in which they are scheduled.
- 7 MR. DUFFY: Right. If I understand your --
- 8 what you're saying, we've tried to budget the time,
- 9 and we -- it's also my impression that we would not be
- 10 running behind schedule on this particular schedule.
- 11 I think that's what we're trying to say.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. Thank you.
- JUDGE RUTH: Mr. Conrad.
- MR. CONRAD: We won't be running behind
- 15 schedule.
- 16 The -- Mr. Duffy kindly mentioned the
- 17 concern we had on our witness, and that was that he
- 18 had scheduling problems that made it necessary for him
- 19 to be there on the 5th. He can be there a day or so
- 20 after that, and I did want him to be present for the
- 21 cross of the other witnesses on that issue.
- The other gentleman, Mr. Duffy mentioned, I
- 23 think is -- was it Mr. Kaplan?
- MR. DUFFY: Yes.
- 25 MR. CONRAD: -- that was coming from DC, and

- 1 we're in the process of working on that, and I've
- 2 committed to let Mr. Duffy know as soon as we can
- 3 whether we would be able to not have questions for him
- 4 so that he would not have to come out.
- 5 Other than that, I'm not aware of any huge
- 6 movement potential on these issues.
- 7 JUDGE RUTH: What day is Mr. Kaplan
- 8 scheduled for?
- 9 MR. DUFFY: Wednesday, June the 6th.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay.
- 11 MR. DOTTHEIM: That is shown in the Addendum
- 12 to List of Issues, List of Witnesses and Order of
- 13 Cross-examination that was filed this morning.
- 14 JUDGE RUTH: Now, was there some indication
- 15 that he might not be coming then?
- MR. DUFFY: No. But after John gets his
- 17 shot at talking about the movement in the schedule, I
- 18 would like to discuss that general topic of some --
- 19 some witnesses and whether the Commission may or may
- 20 not have questions of them, and I'm going to request
- 21 that you ask them so that we may be able to do away
- 22 with the need of some of these people to even come.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay.
- MR. DUFFY: But I don't want to take
- 25 anything from John.

- 1 JUDGE RUTH: Mr. Coffman.
- 2 MR. COFFMAN: Yeah. I think what the others
- 3 have said I can concur in. I think we should be able
- 4 to do this hearing on the dates we've said.
- 5 Our witnesses won't have a problem, though,
- 6 if we are reassessing at some point moving around a
- 7 day in one direction. But I would also note on
- 8 June 6, we have a witness, Mr. Trippensee, who also
- 9 needs to go on June 6th, and I think Mr. Watkins, as
- 10 well. So each of the three parties there that have
- 11 witnesses have one witness that they need to get, I
- 12 guess, on that day, if possible.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: Yeah.
- MR. COFFMAN: And we may go into the next
- day, so, hopefully, we can get Kaplan, Watkins, and
- 16 Trippensee at least on the 6th.
- 17 MR. DOTTHEIM: The Addendum to List of
- 18 Issues, List of Witnesses and Order of
- 19 Cross-examination that was filed earlier this morning
- 20 shows for the witnesses behind the names of Watkins
- 21 and Trippensee the dates -- or the date June 6 so as
- 22 to indicate that because of availability problems it
- 23 is desired that they take the stand on June 6. I
- 24 expect we didn't show June 6 behind Mr. Kaplan, in
- 25 particular, was in that he is scheduled to take the

- 1 stand that day as the -- as the first witness.
- 2 But Mr. Duffy has asked the parties if, in
- 3 particular, there is any need to bring Mr. Kaplan for
- 4 cross-examination, and the Staff still needs to get
- 5 back to Mr. Duffy on that matter.
- 6 MR. CONRAD: As do we.
- 7 MR. DUFFY: Your Honor, if it would be
- 8 appropriate at this point, I would like to just talk
- 9 about the scheduling, in general, and make some
- 10 requests of you to communicate with the Commission and
- 11 also address this to the other parties.
- 12 On Friday, June 1, we have scheduled as a
- 13 depreciation witness Mr. Lyons. He is from
- 14 PricewaterhouseCoopers out of St. Louis. I've
- 15 inquired of the Staff, because they are the -- I think
- 16 the main opponent on that issue, whether there would
- 17 be any cross-examination from them of Mr. Lyons
- 18 because he filed rebuttal but there was no surrebuttal
- 19 filed on him. And Mr. Williams has indicated
- 20 preliminary he doesn't, but he wants to give me a
- 21 final answer tomorrow on whether there would be any
- 22 cross on Mr. Lyons.
- 23 So I would ask the other parties the same
- 24 question, if it's possible to waive cross on Mr. Lyons
- 25 and simply stipulate his testimony into the record

- 1 without him having to come on Friday, and I would like
- 2 to know that by Thursday sometime, because he's on
- 3 vacation and we're making him come home early from
- 4 vacation in order to testify down here, which I'm sure
- 5 he's thrilled about.
- 6 So that would also entail whether the
- 7 Commissioners had any questions for Mr. Lyons. If you
- 8 could inquire of that and then perhaps let us know
- 9 tomorrow, that would be great.
- 10 On -- I guess on a similar basis, I would
- 11 note that the schedule had state line capital costs as
- 12 the first issue on Monday, June the 4th, and on last
- 13 Friday, the parties filed a Unanimous Stipulation and
- 14 Agreement regarding those capital costs.
- We have two outside witnesses on that,
- 16 Ms. Rolph, who would have to be coming from Overland
- 17 Park, Kansas, and Mr. Wilson, who would be coming from
- 18 Nevada, Missouri. Since that issue is subject to a
- 19 Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement, I believe that I
- 20 could speak for the other parties in asking the
- 21 Commission to let us know as soon as possible if they
- 22 are going to be interested in having some sort of a
- 23 presentation or something formally on the record and
- 24 whether we would need to bring in Ms. Rolph and
- 25 Mr. Wilson who have filed testimony on those issues

- 1 that have now been resolved by Stipulation and
- 2 Agreement.
- Finally, as far as, I think, I'm concerned
- 4 for Empire, I would again mention Mr. Kaplan who filed
- 5 prepared testimony for Empire on natural gas prices as
- 6 a part of the fuel and purchase power issue. We do
- 7 have him -- have arrangements and have him scheduled
- 8 to be here and be the first witness on Wednesday, June
- 9 the 6th, but if for some reason the parties and the
- 10 Commissioners have no questions for him, then I'm sure
- 11 it would suit him just fine not to make the trip out
- 12 here from Washington, DC, and we could stipulate his
- 13 testimony into the record without cross. But if
- 14 people have questions for him, we'll certainly have
- 15 him be here.
- I think that's all of the scheduling-type
- 17 things that I can think of at the moment.
- MR. DOTTHEIM: I have one other that has
- 19 occurred to me.
- 20 There has been a Stipulation and Agreement
- 21 filed involving in-service criteria, and I think the
- 22 time for requesting a hearing has -- has passed, and
- 23 there has been no request for a hearing.
- I don't recall if it's literally shown any
- 25 day on the schedule of issues, but, of course, if the

- 1 Commissioners have any questions regarding that area,
- 2 the parties, I assume, would make the witnesses
- 3 available. So maybe if you're checking with the
- 4 Commissioners if they have any questions of certain
- 5 other witnesses, if you might inquire regarding the
- 6 in-service criteria subject area.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay.
- 8 MR. DOTTHEIM: Thank you.
- 9 JUDGE RUTH: Any others I should ask about?
- 10 MR. CONRAD: Just to clarify the record on
- 11 that, my client, Praxair, did not sign on that
- 12 in-service criteria, but did not object to it and did
- 13 not request a hearing, and we have no objection if
- 14 that be treated by the Commission as a unanimous
- 15 stipulation. We just chose not to get on board or
- 16 take a position on that.
- 17 MR. DOTTHEIM: Thank you.
- JUDGE RUTH: Mr. Coffman.
- 19 MR. COFFMAN: I don't have any specific
- 20 requests, but I can on the record state that I won't
- 21 have any cross-examination for Empire witnesses Lyons,
- 22 Rolph, or Wilson. We don't know yet about Kaplan, but
- 23 if no one else has questions for Lyons, Rolph, or
- 24 Wilson, we can waive those.
- 25 MR. CONRAD: Your Honor, I would be happy to

- 1 commit to Mr. Duffy to let him know, or someone else
- 2 know, about those two witnesses on that issue
- 3 tomorrow. Since we're on board on that stipulation,
- 4 I'm pretty sure we would not have cross for them.
- 5 JUDGE RUTH: Please talk to the parties, but
- 6 then also try to remember to address this on the
- 7 record, but you-all can talk among yourselves, too.
- 8 And I will check with the Commissioners and see what
- 9 their feelings are.
- 10 Any other matters?
- 11 MR. CONRAD: Just -- just one quickie here
- 12 since we are on the record.
- 13 I found -- I didn't go back through here and
- 14 count up the number of witnesses but it looks like it
- is probably something like 30 or 35, and some may be
- 16 waived and that may reduce it. I've found that it
- 17 does take a little bit of time to put the witnesses
- 18 on.
- 19 We would offer, as we've done before, to
- 20 stipulate that the foundation questions that we
- 21 typically ask the witnesses, is this your testimony,
- 22 and, did you prepare it, and, if I asked you the same
- 23 questions, and all of those things could be dispensed
- 24 with and the witness simply put on the stand after
- 25 their testimony is -- we've already marked it, after

- 1 their testimony is identified. That saves a minute or
- 2 two per witness, but when you multiply that over
- 3 several witnesses, it saves a couple three hours of
- 4 hearing maybe. We would offer to do that. We have no
- 5 problem going forward on that basis.
- 6 MR. DUFFY: That's fine us with. I assume
- 7 that we would still do the questions, Do you have any
- 8 questions or corrections --
- 9 MR. CONRAD: Sure.
- 10 MR. DUFFY: -- in order to deal with typos
- 11 or something like that? But other than that, that's
- 12 fine.
- MR. CONRAD: Yes, if they have corrections,
- 14 that's fine.
- 15 JUDGE RUTH: Staff or Public Counsel, do you
- 16 have any comment on that suggestion?
- 17 MR. COFFMAN: I can stipulate to that.
- 18 MR. DOTTHEIM: The Staff would have no
- 19 objection to proceeding in that manner.
- JUDGE RUTH: Okay. We'll plan on proceeding
- 21 that way unless for some reason I let you know
- 22 tomorrow that that's not going to work.
- 23 MR. COFFMAN: It seemed to work fairly
- 24 smoothly in a couple of hearings I've done.
- 25 JUDGE RUTH: Any other comments or issues?
