ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

Issue Date: January 14, 2022 Effective Date: January 14, 2022

On December 21, 2021, Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois (ATXI) filed an application with the Commission seeking an order granting a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN). The CCN would authorize ATXI to construct, acquire, own, operate, and maintain certain transmission facilities in, around, and between the cities of New Madrid and Sikeston, Missouri.

On December 30, 2021, the Missouri Joint Municipal Electric Utility Commission (MJMEUC) timely filed an application to intervene. MJMEUC stated it is authorized under Missouri statutes to construct, operate and maintain jointly owned transmission and generation facilities for the production and transmission of electric power for its members, to purchase and sell electric power and energy, and to enter into agreements with any person for the transmission of electric power. MJMEUC members New Madrid and Sikeston, as well as MJMEUC itself, are parties to the project that is the subject of ATXI's application. MJMEUC stated that it has an interest that is different from that of the general public in that it could be directly affected by any decision of the Commission in this file.

Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.080(13) allows parties ten days from the date of filing in which to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

Ten days have passed since the application to intervene was filed and no parties have responded. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that MJMEUC has interests which are different from that of the general public and that may be affected by a final order arising from this file. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The application of MJMEUC to intervene is granted.
- 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
